State auditor releases AUP report for Johnson County PVA

The Johnson County property valuation administrator received an Agreed-Up-on Procedures (AUP) engagement by the state auditor's office for the period July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024.

AUP reports present the procedures performed and the results of those procedures, called findings. The state auditor presents a summary of those findings for which an exception, an instance of non-compliance with the criteria, was identified during the AUP engagement.

During the AUP engagement of the Johnson County PVA, the following exceptions

were noted:

- The PVA did not maintain a receipts or disbursements ledger and does not conduct monthly bank reconciliations.
- The PVA does not charge, issue receipts, or make deposits for all services performed.
- The PVA's final budget could not be compared to actual disbursements since the PVA did not maintain a disbursements ledger.

Findings related to procedures for which there were no exceptions identified and official responses to exceptions are not included in the summary but can be found in the full report. A copy of this report is available on the Auditor of Public Accounts' website at auditor.ky.gov.

Johnson woman facing DUI, endangerment charges

A Johnson County woman is facing charges of DUI and child endangerment following a single-vehicle crash in a Prestonsburg parking lot.

According to the arrest citation written by Prestonsburg Police Officer Jessica Maynard, on April 20, she was dispatched to the Dollar General store on North Lake Drive, Prestonsburg, in reference to a single-vehicle crash.

Maynard wrote that the caller advised a Honda pas-

senger vehicle was stuck on the curb and the driver, who had a baby in the vehicle, appeared to be intoxicated.

Maynard wrote that, when she arrived, she saw the vehicle had backed over the curb and torn through a fence in the parking lot.

The driver, Elizabeth Lane Baker, 30, of Rolling Hills, Hagerhill, told Maynard she was attempting to park when the wreck occurred, the citation said.

Maynard wrote that she could "instantly" smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from Baker and she saw a small child standing in a seat and wear-

ing only a diaper.

The citation said Baker was unable to successfully complete field sobriety tests and refused to submit to an on-scene breath test. Baker, the citation said, told the officer she had drank the night before and often asked the same questions she had previously asked.

The child was released into the custody of a family member and Baker was lodged in the Floyd County Detention Center on charges of first-offense DUI and endangering the welfare of a minor.
