All Terry teams went on to the District

or Regional championships putting them up there with The Bishops that had Lee, Fred and Eddie. Jimbo, played with Fred and Eddie and were members of one the best basketball teams Pineville has ever had - if not the single best. Years ago, I had surgery at the Pineville hospital. One evening I was looking out the window when I

heard a simple knock. It was Mark. He had that same smile his mother had and quietly walked in and said he heard I was in the hospital. It had been years since I had seen him, and we talked briefly when he

looked at me and asked if he could pray for me. He held my hand and led us in prayer. I then realized

what a complete man he was. Never asking for any attention, never asking for anything. A hard working and quiet man who could do it all. I knew he was smart, fast and strong but had some but no idea he was indeed this spiritually strong which now makes me think, if they play sports in heaven, Team Heaven just got stronger.
