MOUNT WASHING-TON – After 13 seasons and 35 matches as combatants in the 24th District, Bullitt East and Mercy developed one of the best rivalries in girls' soccer in the area.

That all changed over the summer when Bullitt East completed a shift to the 23rd District.

Still, the two rivals have been the top two teams in the Sixth Region for the past few seasons and that appears to be the case again this season. That made Wednesday's regular season clash in Mount Washington 'must-see' for area
