## North rallies to beat BC for district title

**HEBRON ESTATES -**Overcoming a quick start by Bullitt Central on Tuesday, the North Bullitt Lady Eagles rallied for a 3-1 victory over their county rivals in volleyball action last week.

The win was important for the Lady Eagles as it gave them the number one seed in the 23rd District. Just last week, the teams were notified that the Sixth Region will be using the Super Regional format for the upcoming post-season.

With wins over their two county rivals this season, the Lady Eagles will claim a fifth straight top spot in the 23rd District even if there is not a district tournament this season. The most important point is that coach Devyn Scott's team will host the first two rounds of the Sixth Region tournament during the week of October 20 before the semifinals and finals are played at Bullitt East the following week.

With the way the 16-team bracket will be set up, North Bullitt could not face either Mercy or Holy Cross, the top two teams in the Sixth Region, before the semifinals. Bullitt East is the number two seed from the 23rd District while Bullitt Central has the number three spot.

Since Bullitt Central swept North Bullitt to win the 23rd District title in 2020, the Lady Eagles have run off 10 wins in the past 12 matches.

At least in the first game on Tuesday, Bullitt Central looked up to task of making it a long night for the Lady Eagles. Coach William Davis' team jumped on top early and rolled to a 25-17 win in the first game.

However, North Bullitt regained their focus and took the next three games. The green and gold rolled to a 25-9 win in the second game and then won some key points to secure the
