Perhaps the biggest point in the game came after the opening scores. The Bullitt Central defense rose up and stopped the Chargers on the next drive helped along by a 14-yard sack by Rylan Morris. That forced a punt that rolled dead at midfield.

Bullitt Central opted for a little trickery. Back-up quarterback Kameron Terrazas took a pitch from Lee and ran left. The quarterback then leaked down the middle of the field. Terrazas' pass was not perfect but Lee went up and battled for the ball, pulling it down and then racing the final 30 yards for a touchdown.

Jeffersontown did score next, this time on a 36-yard run by lightning quick running back Jaden Logan.

Bullitt Central answered with a pair of touchdowns early in the second quarter. The first came at the end of a 66-yard drive with Lee connecting on a nine-yard middle screen to Crenshaw that he easily put

in the end zone. Moments later, Jeffersontown quarterback Nathan Lujan overthrew his intended target and the ball sailed right into the hands of Cougar cornerback Cameron Probus, who returned it 30 yards to the 5-yard line.

Bullitt Central did have an off-sides penalty, but a pair of positive runs from Crenshaw and then Lee, put the ball at the two-yard line and Crenshaw scored easily on third down.

That put the Cougars up 27-12, but the big plays were not

the shutout.

CENTRAL STRUGGLES

The final record was not what the coach or team wanted and a closing 0-4-1 mark is a head scratcher, but despite the 6-9-2 final record, Bullitt Central has been competitive even against the top teams in the Sixth Region this season.

That was the case again in the final game of the regular season on Monday as the maroon and gray battled to the end, but they still came up short, falling on the road to Holy Cross 2-1.

The player scoring the goal for the Cougars was not posted as of press time for this edition.

On the next drive, Jeffersontown converted one fourth-down play and then had another near midfield. This time Lujan connected with Stehen Green for a 51-yard touchdown. Bullitt Central then seemingly had the Chargers backed up in the final 90 seconds of the half only to have Lujan find Logan on a short screen and the speedy back turned that into an 88-yard touchdown.

The second half belonged to the Bullitt Central defense as that group held the Chargers to just a pair of first downs.

Bullitt Central had won the toss and elected to defer and got the ball to start the second half, but the first drive went nowhere. Jeffersontown did get a first down and moved into Cougar territory but the Cougars held on another fourth down. This time the offense responded with a 66-yard drive fueled by a 12-yard pass from Lee to Morris and later a 23-yard pass to Jose Barajas. Lee

had a 15-yard run that then set up Crenshaw scoring on a seven-yard run.

On the third play of the fourth quarter, the home team added some breathing room when Crenshaw capped a 63-yard drive with a 17-yard burst up the middle to the end zone.

Twice late in the game Jeffersontown had to go for it on fourth down deep in their own territory and each time the defense rose to the occasion. Bullitt Central failed to score after the first chance, but connected on the next opportunity when they only had to go 23-yards on five plays. Kolton Begley carried the ball on the first four plays before Lee kept it around the left side for the one-yard touchdown.

That score put the game out of reach, but Jeffersontown did answer on the very next play as back-up quarterback Kaiden Bradley connected on an 80-yard touchdown to Green against some of the Cougar back-ups.

Bullitt Central recovered the on-sides kick and then ran out the clock.

Besides the 143 yards on the ground from Crenshaw, Bullitt Central also got 63 yards on 11 carries by Lee as the Cougars finished with 248 yards rushing.

Lee had a good night as he completed 14 of his 19 passes for 118 yards with one touchdown. Terrazas added 51 yards to the passing total with his touchdown pass to Lee.

Five of Lee's passes were hauled in by Barajas for 50 yards and both Morris and Crenshaw had four catches.

On defense, the Cougars got ten tackles from Damien Finn and nine by Morris. Leatherwood, who like Finn is a sophomore, had six total tackles.

Next Game: After the week off, the Cougars will be facing a Fairdale team with a 2-4 record but they have beaten Jeffersontown. Fairdale is playing at home against North Bullitt this Friday in a match-up of the Cougars' next two opponents.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 024-020 ADOPTING THE CITY OF SHEPHERDSVILLE, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY SEWER OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2024, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2025, BY ESTIMATING THE REVENUES AND RESOURCES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE SEWER DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS the City Council adopted Ordinance 024-020 adopting the annual sewer operation and maintenance budget for fiscal year July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025, on June 10, 2024; and

WHEREAS the City Council desires to amend Ordinance 024-020 to more accurately reflect the City's operations during the fiscal year July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025;
