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Request for Release of Funds

On or about July 31, 2025, the City of Cumberland will submit a request to the Department for Local Government for the release of Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383), as well as Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) funds, to undertake the following project:

Project Title:

Cumberland 10 Inch Waterline Upgrade

Project Description:

This project will install new water infrastructure, including a 10-inch waterline, storage tank, and pump station, to improve water service in the City of Cumberland and extend potable water access to underserved areas near the Harlan-Letcher County line.

Location:

Mastin Drive, Cumberland, Harlan County, KY

Census Tract:

9707

Funding:

The project is supported by a \$500,000 grant from the Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC), in addition to CDBG-DR funds from the Department for Local Government.

Finding of No Significant Impact

The City of Cumberland has determined, based on the completed Environmental Assessment (EA), that the proposed project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) (PL 91-190) is not required.

Public Comments

All interested agencies, groups, and persons disagreeing with this determination are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the City of Cumberland. Comments must specify which notice they address.

Environmental Certification

The City of Cumberland will undertake the project described above with CD-BG-DR and ARC funds. In doing so, the City is certifying that it has carried out the environmental review process and accepts the jurisdiction of federal courts if action is brought to enforce environmental responsibilities. Upon approval of the certification, the City of Cumberland may use the funds and the State and HUD will be considered to have fulfilled their responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities.

Objection to Release of Funds

The State will accept objections to the release of funds and the City of Cumberland's certification for a period of fifteen days following submission or actual receipt of the request (whichever is later), but only on the following

- (a) The certification was not executed by the City of Cumberland's Certifying Officer.
- (b) The City failed to make required findings under 24 CFR 58.41 or determinations under 58.52, 58.53, or 58.64.
 - (c) The City omitted steps in Subparts F and G related to the EA process.
- (d) The Advisory Council on Historic Preservation was not given an opportunity to review effects on eligible historic properties.
 - (e) Funds were committed or actions taken before HUD or State approval.
- (f) A Federal agency submitted a finding that the project is unsatisfactory in terms of environmental quality.
