Sentencing

Arturo Castro Perez, 21, of Versailles, was sentenced to two years in prison and ordered to pay a \$200 fine after pleading guilty to operating on a suspended/revoked operator's license (misdemeanor), two counts of first-degree wanton endangerment (police officer), reckless driving (violation) and disregarding a traffic control device (traffic light/violation). A third count of first-degree wanton endangerment (police officer), a charge of first-degree fleeing or evading police (motor vehicle) and a misdemeanor charge of violation of conditions of release were dismissed under the plea agreement.

Pleas

Noah Floyd, 20, of Versailles, pleaded guilty to an amended charge of second-degree robbery, first-degree wanton endangerment and intimidating a participant in a legal process. The commonwealth recommended 13 years in prison.

Tommy L. McCane, 45, of Midway, pleaded guilty to first-degree possession of a controlled substance. The commonwealth recommended 18 months in prison.

Brandon L. Wilson, 34, of Versailles, pleaded guilty to first-degree possession of a controlled substance and possession of drug paraphernalia (misdemeanor).

The commonwealth recommended two years and one day in prison.

Arraignments

Kayla Hadley, 21, of Frankfort, pleaded not guilty to two counts of first-degree possession of a controlled substance and possession of drug paraphernalia (misdemeanor).

Woodford County Library.

"And so I actually was really excited to kind of jump in and take charge of that collection," says Daniels.

Besides having a genealogy library, the Woodford County Historical Society had original collections in more than five thousand files, including deeds dating back to the 1700s. On day two as the history librarian, Daniels says she discovered two of statesman Henry Clay's law books - and a book from 1633 was found.

Because of the research migration pattern that people often have to follow when delving into their family ge-

nealogy, Daniels says she was "very delighted to realize" that the genealogy book collection in the History Room expands outside of Woodford County and Kentucky, originally a part of Virginia.

Daniels, who's lived in Georgetown for 20 years, says she earned a master's degree in library science with a focus on archival management at the University of Kentucky. During her more than 30 years of doing genealogical research, she produced and hosted the Bloodroot Podcast, was manager of the Kentucky Historical Society's library, and most recently was director of the SAR (Sons of the American Revolution) Genealogical Research Library.

Those experiences, coupled with her education, Daniels says, have given her the necessary training and skills to oversee public access to the Woodford County Library's collections and materials, which were reprocessed and organized by her predecessors in the History Room.

For library patrons who don't have family roots in Woodford County, the History Room has free digital resources to help them research and discover their genealogy, Daniels says, pointing out a Digital Legacy Lab will soon allow 8mm film, VHS cassettes, photographs and other legacy formats to be converted to digital files.
