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

Midway University breaks ground on new James A. & Martha R. Brown Library

Midway University completed its fundraising for the new James A. & Martha R. Brown Library in March and held a celebratory groundbreaking followed by a luncheon on Thursday, May 9. Midway University Presi-

dent John Marsden said the project "has only been made possible through the extraordinary generosity of many," nodding "first to our most recent anonymous donor whose visionary gift allowed us to accelerate the construction timeline.

Marsden said the new library will be ready December 2026.

The library "marks a significant milestone in the university's commitment to enhancing academic resources and accommodating its growing student population," according to a press release.

Marsden explained at the ceremony that the new library is the second of a three-phase student-centered building plan, which will address the on-campus housing shortage caused by the significant increase in enrollment and students who wish to live on

"The first phase, supported by (Trustee Jan Hunter and her husband Richard), involved converting the second floor of the Little Memorial Library into student housing, which opened in the fall of 2023," Marsden said. "The new Brown Library is phase two . . . the third, and final phase, will convert the remaining floors of Little Memorial Library into muchneeded residential space, and the funding for that is already secured."
