
# Celebrating **Constitution Week**

## SOLAR,

constructed in the Mt.

Public Notice published in The Times Journal said.

Last Thursday, the entity presented information about the "proposed Russell County Solar Park... (to be) located on approximately 450 acres in the vicinity of Old Sano Rd and Bottoms Rd, South of Sano Rd, approximately five miles north of Russell Springs."

Some citizens attending the meeting at the Russell County Publilc Library, in Jamestown, questioned the status of a similar project announced almost three years ago in which a solar facility was to be Olive area.

A representative for Round Trip, LLC said the current, proposal is not connected to the former project.

The representative said his company may visit the Russell County Fiscal Court as early as next month to discuss the project and offer details.

The recent public meeting included "an overview of the project, answers to common community questions, and responses to questions submitted."

The proposed "photovoltaic solar project" will consist of "solar panels installed on

racks with an approximate maximum height of 15 feet, inverters, transformers, an energy storage system, associated wiring and balance of system, and a substation," a public notice said.

"The power generated by the project will be linked to the electric transmission grid via direct connection an existing EKPC transmission substation on or near the property," published information said. "The project will install a visual vegetative buffer along portions of the perimeter of the project two staggered rows of native, evergreen plantings."
