Several tax issues occurred in April including federal income taxes and Morehead City Council passing the mayor's 2025/26 budget without line-item restrictions nor cutting property taxes. In addition, this week Morehead property owners received their 2025 property tax assessments in the mail.

The Rowan County Property Evaluation Administration (PVA) assesses property in Morehead and Rowan County and sets the property valproperty owners may like the value of their property increasing, it could also be used by the mayor and council to generate more revenue.

When I spoke with Rowan County PVA, Ms. Carman Swim stated her office does not set Morehead's tax rate, only the assessment of property. She also suggested that after taxpayers receive their new property evaluation, they are welcome to contact her office with any questions. The PVA office is in the Rowan County Courthouse or phone number is 606-784-5512. She said they will be happy to conference, explain the objection process and answer questions. If there is a disagreement with the new property evaluation taxpayers cannot wait until this fall's tax bills but must contact the PVA's office May 5-May 19.

Morehead's property tax rate is different than the PVA's assessment.
