ORDINANCE 2025-05
AMENDING HICKMAN COUNTY ORDINANCE 2008-3

AN ORDINANCE OF THE FISCAL COURT OF HICKMAN COUNTY, RELATING TO
THE IMPOSITION AND PAYMENT INTO THE TREASURY OF HICKMAN COUNTY,
KENTUCKY, OF LICENSE FEES BASED ON THE EXERCISE OF ACTIVITIES NECES-
SARY TO CARRY ON BUSINESSES, TRADES, PROFESSIONS AND OCCUPATIONS
IN HICKMAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY. THIS LICENSE FEE IS FOR GENERAL CAPI-
TAL OUTLAY PURPOSES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ROADS, BRIDGES,
EQUIPMENT PURCHASES, AND DEBT REDUCTION AT THE HICKMAN COUNTY
DETENTION CENTER.

Pursuant to KRS 67.077 Passage of Ordinance and Amendments and Additions to the pro-
posed Ordinance relating to the imposition and payment into the Treasury of Hickman
County, Kentucky of License Fees based on the exercise of activities necessary to carry on
businesses, trades, professions and occupations in Hickman County, Kentucky. This License
Fee is for general capital outlay purposes, including but not limited to roads, bridges, equip-
ment purchases, and debt reduction at the Hickman County Detention Center.

MAXIMUM ANNUAL TAXATION
No taxpayer, whether individual or corporate, shall be require to pay more than One Thou-
sand Dollars (\$1000.00) in any one calendar year; except that for calendar year 2026 no tax-
payer shall be required to pay more than Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00).
Ordinance was considered at the October 23, 2025 meeting of the Fiscal Court of Hickman
County, Kentucky at 8:00 a.m. Central Standard Time in the Office of the Judge Executive
of Hickman County, 116 S. Jefferson Street, Clinton, Kentucky. The second reading of this
Amended Ordinance is scheduled for November 24, 2025 at 8:00 a.m.

a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.
