



### Lady Falcons fall to Lady Comets in district game

CLINTON — Carlisle County dealt Hickman County its first loss in the 2025-26 girls' high school basketball season, defeating the Lady Falcons 68-38 on Friday, Dec. 12.

The Lady Comets prevailed in a 1st District hoops matchup.

Following the loss, Hickman County slipped to 3-1 overall and opened 0-1 in the 1st District.

Carlisle County shot 40.7 percent (24-of-59) from the field. The Lady Comets shot 33.3 percent (nine-of-27) from three-point range.

Nearly automatic in a key area, Carlisle County shot 91.7 percent (11-of-12) from the free throw line.

Carlisle County thrived outside and inside, out-rebounding Hickman County 44-25.

Rylee Lemons and Macee Hogancamp shared game-high scoring honors for Carlisle County, netting 15 points apiece. Hogancamp registered a double-double, securing a game-high 13 rebounds.

Accompanying Lemons and Hogancamp in double figures for Carlisle County, Eden Bruer netted 12 points.

Britton paced Hickman County inside, claiming seven rebounds.

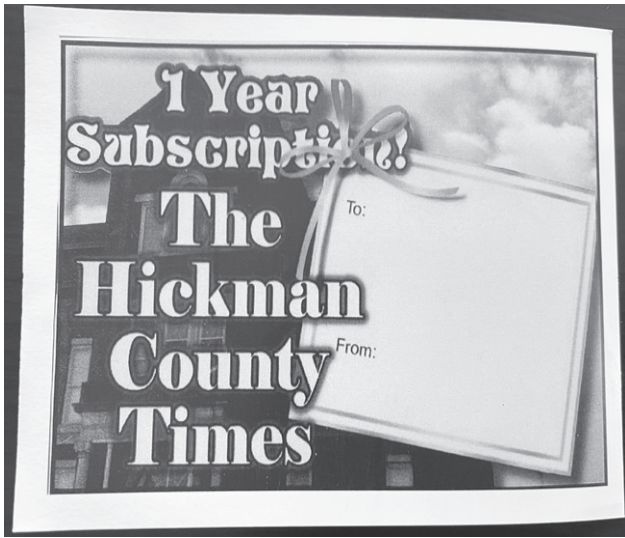
