## City works with manufacturer on possible expansion, jobs, and infrastructure improvements

The City of Columbia is working with a local manufacturing company on a possible expansion that could bring dozens of new jobs and a major capital investment to the community. Mayor Pamela Hoots shared the update last week, noting that the city is already assisting with several key components tied to the project.

"For your information, the City of Columbia is currently working with a local manufacturing company relative to a possible expansion at their location in Columbia," Hoots said. "The City is currently assisting with additional gas utility infrastructure, road improvements, and grant applications.

This expansion may be adding 40 or more jobs to our community, a new manufacturing facility, and additional opportunities for our town."

That announcement was followed Tuesday by a public hearing focused on the city's request to apply for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) to support equipment procurement for a local industrial operation.

According to the news release, the grant application is tied to tentative expansion plans by CIRCOR, a global manufacturer specializing in critical fluid handling solutions. The company produces a wide range of equipment, including pumps, valves, regulators, actuators, switches, motors,

and sensors, serving industries such as oil and gas, power generation, aerospace, defense, and scientific research.

CIRCOR's proposed investment in Columbia is estimated at more than \$16 million, covering building construction, machinery, and equipment. "We are excited about the prospect of CIRCOR's tentative expansion plans," Mayor Hoots said in the release. "This is an important development for our community."

City officials said the proposed Community Development Block Grant is tentatively planned to result in the creation of up to 50 full-time jobs, with at least 51 percent of those positions to be filled by low- to moderate-income

residents, meeting federal program guidelines.

In addition to grant assistance, the city is coordinating infrastructure improvements needed to support the potential expansion, including utility upgrades and roadway improvements near the facility. Officials emphasized that the project remains in the planning stage, but described the discussions as encouraging.

More details are expected as the process moves forward. City leaders said additional information will be released once plans are finalized, and a press conference is expected to be scheduled in the near future to outline the project and its anticipated impact on Columbia's workforce and economy.

## Rogers Scholars, Explorers programs open to Adair County students

Current eighth- and 10th-grade students in Adair County Schools are being encouraged to apply for two well-established summer youth leadership programs that aim to prepare the region's next generation of leaders.

The Center for Rural Development is now accepting applications for the 2026 Rogers Scholars and Rogers Explorers programs. Applications for both programs must be submitted online by January 31, 2026, at [www.centeryouthprograms.com](http://www.centeryouthprograms.com).

The Rogers Scholars program is open to current 10th-grade students and is considered the Center's flagship youth leadership initiative. Designed for students entering their junior year of high school, the week-

long residential program focuses on leadership development, technology, entrepreneurship, and community service.

Selected students spend one week on the campus of either Lindsey Wilson University or Morehead State University, where they take part in team-building exercises, leadership training, and hands-on instruction from professionals in fields such as engineering, healthcare, and civic engagement. Participants also have opportunities to interact with nationally recognized business leaders and entrepreneurs.

In addition to leadership training, the Rogers Scholars program offers exclusive college scholarship opportunities. All lodging, meals, and program-related expenses are covered at

no cost to students, with transportation to and from the program being the only responsibility of families.

The Rogers Explorers program is geared toward current eighth-grade students and provides an intensive three-day, two-night introduction to leadership, teamwork, technology, math, science, and career pathway exploration. Students attend the program during the summer before entering ninth grade.

Explorers may be hosted on the campuses of University of the Appalachians, Eastern Kentucky University, Union Commonwealth University, University of Pikeville, Lindsey Wilson University, or Morehead State University. The program emphasizes hands-on, interactive learning, allowing students

to participate in practical college-level activities while building leadership skills and forming connections with peers from across Southern and Eastern Kentucky.

Both programs are open to students who live within the Center's 45-county primary service area, which includes Adair, Casey, Cumberland, Green, Metcalfe, Russell, and Taylor counties. All lodging, meals, and program expenses are provided at no cost, except for transportation.
