

# Boyle County Public Library activities: May 4-9

The library will host the All Abilities Resource Fair on Monday, May 4 from 1:30-2:30 p.m. to highlight area resources available to people with physical, intellectual, and developmental disabilities. This will be followed by an information session beginning at 2:45 p.m. presented by BCPL staff on available resources through the library for individuals with disabilities and their caregivers. Participating organizations in the resource fair include Kids Can Do, A Brighter Choice, Holland Miracle Farms, Special Persons Advocacy Network (SPAN), GLOW, Pioneer Vocational/Industrial Resources, Independence Place, Hooves of Hope, and others. It is open year-round, Tuesday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., Saturday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday from noon to 4 p.m. For more information, visit
