**ORDINANCE NO. 2064**

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE REGULATORY LICENSE FEE FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN THE CITY OF DANVILLE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026-2027.

WHEREAS, the City of Danville, Kentucky (hereinafter "City") is authorized to impose a regulatory license fee on the sale of alcoholic beverages of each establishment therein licensed to sell alcoholic beverages pursuant to the KRS 243.075 and City of Danville Ordinance Section 2.5- 19; and

WHEREAS, the City has reviewed the regulatory license fee revenues from the prior fiscal year as well as the expenditures related to the additional policing, regulatory and administrative expenses related to the sale of alcoholic beverages in the City, with a copy of income statement being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the City finds that the current regulatory license fees are lacking in comparison to other Kentucky cities and do not adequately reimburse the City for the additional policing, regulatory and administrative expenses related to the sale of alcoholic beverages in the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Danville, Kentucky, as follows:

**SECTION ONE:** The regulatory license fee shall be five percent (5%) of gross sales of all alcoholic beverages sold by the drink. In the case of retail sales of package distilled spirits and wine, the regulatory license fee shall be five percent (5%) of gross sales. The regulatory license fee shall be five percent (5%) on gross retail sales of package malt beverages.

**SECTION TWO:** If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason declared illegal, unconstitutional, or otherwise invalid, such declaration shall not affect the remaining portions hereof.

**SECTION THREE:** If any provision of this Ordinance is in conflict with provisions of existing Ordinances or laws, it is the intent of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Danville, Kentucky, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall govern, and such provisions in existing Ordinances or Laws in conflict herewith are hereby rescinded.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2068**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL STORMWATER MANAGEMENT FEE SCHEDULE IN CHAPTER 6.5 (FLOOD PREVENTION AND STORMWATER MANAGEMENT), ARTICLE IV (STORMWATER MANAGEMENT FEE) SECTION 6.5-56 (RATES) IN THE CITY OF DANVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES.

WHEREAS, in 2007 the City of Danville enacted Ordinance No. 1726 pertaining to the establishment of a stormwater utility and the management of stormwater within the City; and

WHEREAS, in 2008 the City enacted Ordinance No. 1736 to revise the stormwater management fee schedule, with the intent that the fees charged by the City shall at all times cover the cost of operation of the utility and the cost of stormwater management; and

WHEREAS, in 2025 the City enacted Ordinance No. 2053 to revise the stormwater management fee schedule, with the intent that the fees charged by the City shall at all times cover the cost of operation of the utility and the cost of stormwater management; and

WHEREAS, the City now finds it necessary and appropriate to revise the rate schedule below to reflect cost of living adjustments;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Danville, Kentucky, as follows:

**SECTION ONE:**  
Section 6.5-55 (Classification of property for determination of stormwater management fee) in Chapter 6.5 (Flood Prevention and Stormwater Management), Article IV (Stormwater Management Fee) of the City of Danville Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

**Sec. 6.5-55. Classification of property for determination of stormwater management fee.**  
For purposes of determining the stormwater management fee, all properties in the City of Danville are classified into one of the following classes:

(a) *Single family residential (SFR) property.* The Commission finds that the contribution to runoff of most parcels of real property in the City of Danville classified as single family residential is similar and that it would be excessively and unnecessarily expensive to determine precisely the square footage of the improvements (such as building, structures, and other impervious areas) on each parcel. Therefore, all single family residential properties in the city shall be charged a flat stormwater management fee, equal to the base rate, as provided in section 6.5-56.

(b) *Non-single family residential (non-SFR) property.* The fee for non-SFR property in the City of Danville shall be the base rate multiplied by the numerical factor obtained by dividing the total impervious area (square feet) of the property by the ERU. The impervious surface area for non-SFR property is the square footage for the buildings and other improvements on the property. At the sole discretion of the City Commission, the impervious surface area of non-SFR property may be approximated through site examination, mapping information, aerial photographs, and other available information. The minimum stormwater management fee for non-SFR property shall equal the base rate for single family residential property.

(c) *Non-developed property.* The fee for non-developed property in the City of Danville shall be a flat stormwater management fee equal to the base rate as provided in section 6.5-56 none.

**SECTION TWO:**  
Section 6.5-56 (Rates) in Chapter 6.5 (Flood Prevention and Stormwater Management), Article IV (Stormwater Management Fee) of the City of Danville Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

**Sec. 6.5-56. Rates**

(a) *Base rate.* A monthly base rate for the stormwater management fee is established for all single family residential property per ERU.

(b) *Schedule of monthly rates for stormwater management fee.* The following schedule of rates shall apply to each property owner. This schedule includes the rate for the stormwater fees.

RATE CATEGORY	RATE PER MONTH
Single family residential	\$3.75 <del>\$3.85</del>
Non-single family residential	\$3.75 <del>\$3.85</del> , Multiplied by the numerical factor obtained by dividing the total impervious area (square feet) of the property by one (1) equivalent.

(c) Commencing effective July 1, 2026, the stormwater management fee rate contained in CDO section 6.5-56 shall be adjusted annually in accordance with KRS 83A.075 as may be amended from time to time, so as to allow automatic cost of living adjustments based on the purchasing power of the dollar as computed by the State of Kentucky Finance and Administration Cabinet.

**SECTION THREE:** This ordinance is effective as soon thereafter as published in the Advocate-Messenger after two successful readings.

**SECTION FOUR:** If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is declared illegal or unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such declaration shall not affect the remaining portions hereof.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2066**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DANVILLE, KENTUCKY, ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 7-1-2026 THROUGH 6-30-2027 BY APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF CITY GOVERNMENT.

WHEREAS, an annual budget proposal and message has been prepared and delivered by the City Manager to the Board of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has reviewed said budget proposal and made any necessary modifications;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF DANVILLE, KENTUCKY:

**SECTION ONE:** The annual budget for the fiscal year beginning 7-1-2026 and ending 6-30-2027 is adopted with appropriations by programs and funds as follows:
