law enforcement experience, Dockery is an experienced volunteer firefighter and a lifelong Butler County resident who said he deeply cares about the community.


"I have lived in Butler County my whole life and deeply care about the community,"

Dockery said.


Dockery is a husband, father, and pastor, and said he hopes to bring his experience and passion to the jailer's position if elected.





MASTER COMMISSIONER SALE

BY VIRTUE OF A DECREE AND ORDER OF SALE OF THE BUTLER CIRCUIT COURT, the Master Commissioner will sell at public auction the real property in the following action on Friday, February 13, 2026 about the hour of 10:00 a.m. at the Courthouse Door of the Butler County Courthouse located on Main Street in Morgantown, Butler County, Kentucky. A.
