This property consists of 25.378 acres, with exception of a 1.001 acre parcel on which sets a doublewide converted to real estate. Also contained in this sale is a 1.001 acre parcel on which sets a doublewide converted to real estate. Both parcels are further described in deed book 226, Page 57, Bracken County Clerk. Parcel 19B-1 is the doublewide converted to real estate and Mapping Number: 57-19B-1 contains the 25.378 acres, with the exception of the 1.001 acre parcel on which sets the doublewide converted to real estate.
