The funeral service will be live-streamed at noon Friday, May 3, on Goodwin Funeral Home, Inc.'s, YouTube channel.


Jesse Calvin Sumner

organization and rules and regulations," she said of student trips. "I don't think it's appropriate for our students to be out on the beach at 10 o'clock at night without having a chaperone, and there was not even a chaperone in the hotel. I just that that's opening up an area of concern that could go sideways."

Sheehan said she'd like for anyone who is doing an overnight trip to have an agenda and a list that schedules events, chaperones, the location of students and the like.

"... The people who have these trips need to do a better job planning, setting expectations, letting the rules be known

and having appropriate supervision," Sheehan noted.

Thorpe said he will work with other officials to create a plan to address the issue and will present that plan to the school board.

In other business:
• The superintendent, also a member of Cadiz Rotary Club, noted that local schools raised \$29,000 for the Cadiz Rotary Radio Auction.

• The school board approved a request for proposal for the cafeteria's used tables and chairs, allowing the sale of those items.

• Director of Food Service Lisa Marsh said she is applying for a Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Grant that will provide different types of snacks to students at Trigg County Primary

School in an effort to expose the youth to new foods.

• Director of Student Services and Personnel James Mangels said attendance in the district is roughly 1.45% higher than "where we were last year," and he noted that the district is getting close to its 95% attendance goal.

• The board approved payments for the new career and technical center including \$256,635.09 to A&K Construction, \$3,400 to C&I Supply and \$30,177.08 to R.L. Craig.

• Board members also approved a \$87,978.31 payment to A&K Construction for the school district's new multipurpose facility.
