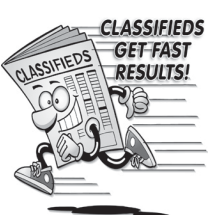

ALLEN GRAND JURY

The Allen Grand Jury met February 25 and returned the following indictments.

- Jordan D. Blankenship, fourth-degree assault domestic violence minor injury, possession of marijuana, possession of drug paraphernalia, and receiving stolen property.
- Timothy W. Graves, second-degree criminal mischief, and second-degree burglary.
- Darren E. Russell, third-degree assault on healthcare provider, third-degree terroristic threatening, and second-degree disorderly conduct.
- David A. Dismond, first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), tampering with physical evidence, and first-degree persistent felony offender.
- Tina M. Cox, no registration plates, first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), tampering with physical evidence, and first-degree promoting contraband.
- Joshua C. Temple, operating on suspended or revoked operators license, driving without a license, operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol, theft by unlawful taking of an automobile \$10,000 or more but under \$1,000,000, and first-degree criminal mischief.
- Shelly K. Taylor, first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance (methamphetamine), possession of drug paraphernalia, and first-degree persistent felony offender.
- James R. Moore, failure to or improper signal, operating on suspended or revoked operators license, first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance (methamphetamine), and second-degree persistent felony offender.
- John W. White, failure to produce insurance card, careless driving, operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol, and first-degree possession of a controlled substance (cocaine).
- Michael E. Scott, failure to or improper signal, following another vehicle too closely, failure of owner to maintain required insurance, trafficking in marijuana, and first-degree persistent felony

- offender.
- Heather McPeak, driving on DUI suspended license, failure to produce insurance card, failure of owner to maintain required insurance, and first-degree persistent felony offender.
- Tanner A. May, theft of identity of another without consent, driving on DUI suspended license, and second-degree persistent felony offender.
- Michael Lee Little, disregarding stop sign, improper passing, speeding 26 miles per hour or greater over the speed limit, first-degree fleeing or evading police, disregarding traffic control device (traffic light), improper display of registration plates, and no motorcycle operators license.
- Jeffrey A. Glass, cultivating in marijuana, trafficking in marijuana, and possession of drug paraphernalia.
- Jordan D. Blankenship, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.
- Jonathan S. Miller, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, two counts of first-degree persistent felony offender, second-degree burglary, and public intoxication of a controlled substance.
- Bryan J. Escue, first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), possession of drug paraphernalia, and endangering the welfare of a minor.
- Scottie P. Costello, three counts of first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), and three counts of possession of drug paraphernalia.
- Cory M. Carter, possession of marijuana, first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), controlled substance prescription not in original container, two counts of possession of drug paraphernalia, operating a motor vehicle while under the influence, and first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance (methamphetamine).
- Taylor J. Shelton, complicity to trafficking in marijuana.
- Megan Tiffany Sequira, first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance (methamphetamine), possession of drug paraphernalia, first-degree

- possession of a controlled substance (drug unspecified), and possession of marijuana.
 - Joshua Lashley, third-degree assault on police or probation officer, second-degree indecent exposure, resisting arrest, first-degree disorderly conduct, and alcohol intoxication in a public place.
 - Michael Stewart, operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of controlled substances, first-degree possession of a controlled substance (drug unspecified), possession of drug paraphernalia, and first-degree possession of a controlled substance (hydrocodone).
 - Cory L. Shrum, possession of a handgun by a convicted felon, first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), and possession of drug paraphernalia.
 - Ronnie H. Scott, first-degree wanton endangerment.
 - Jason R. Richardson, no registration plates, failure of non-owner operator to maintain required insurance, no registration receipt, first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), and possession of drug paraphernalia.
 - Randy J. Pedigo, failure to comply with sex offender registration, and first-degree persistent felony offender.
 - Timothy Montgomery, improper registration plate, failure to register transfer of motor vehicle, failure of owner to maintain required insurance, and first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine).
 - Cody B. Black, speeding 26 miles per hour or greater over the speed limit, reckless driving, first-degree fleeing or evading police, and disregarding traffic control device (traffic light).
 - Justin A. Phillips, two counts of first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), carrying a concealed deadly weapon, two counts of tampering with physical evidence, possession of drug paraphernalia, two counts of first-degree persistent felony offender, and possession of marijuana.
- (An indictment is a formal charge with the actual guilt or innocence of the defendant to be decided in further court proceedings.)
