traveling north on Harrison School Road. Dispatch advised the vehicle had unconfirmed insurance and a traffic stop was conducted.

Upon making contact with the operator, deputies detected a strong smell of marijuana emanating from inside the vehicle. The passenger, identified as Cheyenne Bunch, admitted there was marijuana in the vehicle on the passenger side where she was seated, and stated that all of it was legally purchased from a

dispensary where she is employed in Tennessee, and advised it all belonged to her.

A search of the passenger side of the vehicle revealed a large quantity of pre-rolled burnt marijuana joints, as well as a small amount of green leafy substance located in a sealed unlabeled bag. Additionally, deputies located a glass pipe in the center console containing burnt suspected marijuana residue.

All item were seized and logged into

evidence at the Allen County Sheriff's Office.

A citation was issued without further incident.

Cheyenne Bunch was charged with possession of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia.

The following people were picked up on active warrants: Dustin M. Graves, failure to appear and Bradley R. McPeak, failure to appear.

Nature assisted with flora and fauna monuments within the undisturbed earth mounds as well. As generations of descendants and time elapsed the family graves could become forgotten or even desecrated with livestock or development as family farms became divided into smaller plots and greater opportunities afforded in other lands far away.

History insight has become alive within the old city cemetery with portrayal of past residents by Allen County Historical Society annual Graveline Tour each fall. Commission members have held a cemetery education and training event with hands-on opportunity in techniques in gravestone cleaning, preservation and documentation. A pursuit of lost history within the cemetery grounds involved Ground Penetrating Radar surveillance of areas without gravestones. The commission is assisting in documentation of gravestones within Crescent Hill, Crown Hill, First Baptist Church and Old City Cemeteries by Scottsville

Geographic Information System (GIS) officials.

The commission has also assisted in Allen County projects outside of the Central Business District including Scottsville Train Depot William G. Pomeroy Foundation Transportation Signage, Caney Fork Rosenwald School and Church Campus, Public Springhouse, Allen County Revolutionary War Veterans research, Dumont Hill Expedition Civil War Walking Tour with third grade students, along with 19 grant application submissions and management for additional funding toward historical site preservation.

Another rewarding idea brought to fruition involved more than 140 Hometown Hero Banners erected around the Allen County Judicial Center and adjacent area of Veterans serving in branches of arm forces. This ongoing endeavor is receiving additional submissions for a rotating display over time.

Commission Board members are Holly Wood, Gayle Davis, Ed

Anglea, Dolorse Rice and Elizabeth Buchanon and meet the third Thursday at 6 p.m. at the City-Council Room of the City-Council Building.

Traditions of homecomings is also fading into memories as younger life commitments does not always allow dedicated family time and reminiscing seems to be for seniors. Years ago an adage related, If an individual had partaken of an Allen County water spring drink, their body would be brought "home" for burial in a family plot.

The adage sprang from opportunities in northern industries for individual jobs and migration of Allen Countians establishing families in other areas in earlier decades.
