The sixth rule is a guideline that extends to school facilities. The guideline says, “school athletics facilities may not be used for organized competition at which students from the high school are participants and for which no rental/lease arrangement exists using comparable regional fair market values” with point seven saying “The school athletics facilities may not be used for organized competition at which students from the school are participants and at which members of the high school coaching staff are involved in coaching or facility management and preparation.”

The next rule includes a name, image and likeness guideline. Point eight says, “The school nickname, school name or other accepted likeness may not be used on school issued apparel, and the school name, nickname or other accepted likeness may not be used in any other facet of athletic activity.” For example, by the “letter of the law,” this guideline prohibits a swim cap with the school logo being worn by a swimmer

while competing in a non-school related meet during the Dead Period. The swimmer may participate but not wear a school-issued piece of equipment.

Guideline nine notes that “No fund raising activity may require the participation, either implicitly or explicitly, of the student-athlete or parents; and the students and coaches cannot be together in any of these type of activities.” Point 10 says “There cannot be distribution of equipment, uniforms or other school-owned or playing rules required equipment to student-athletes with eligibility remaining, including but not limited to football or baseball catching gear.” The next point notes “There cannot be money spent on travel to or from a camp, clinic or other activity during the Dead Period, even if none of the practice, competition or evaluation occurs during the Dead Period as this is an expenditure of school funds or resources in support of athletics.”

Furthermore, the guidelines say that

“There can be no direct communication to any student-athlete by a coach or member of the coaching staff/team regarding activities that are being held either during the dead period, or after.” This includes any form of communication, verbal and written, as well as using any medium including social media within the restrictions and allowances otherwise detailed.”

The guidelines also include a section detailing at length what coaches can and cannot do during the Dead Period. In short, a coach is prohibited from any contact with their student-athletes. This would include watching his/her student-athletics at individual team camps or non-school related activities. The only exception is that a coach may watch his/her child participate.

After the Dead Period ends at midnight on July 9, summer activities may resume per guidelines with regard to season limitations. Typically, fall sports may resume conditioning with “official practice” beginning July 15.

UK officials also noted that the applicant pool was among the most competitive in the institution’s history.

The Otis A. Singletary Scholarship covers the full cost of tuition and mandatory fees for traditional undergraduate coursework for up to four years or eight semesters. In addition, the award provides a \$10,000 annual housing stipend during the first and second years for students residing on campus in university housing.

The highly competitive application process and selection highlights the work of Ausbrooks in the classroom and community involvement over the course of her time at AC-SH. Ausbrooks’ academic efforts included opportunities provided through the high school’s AP (Advanced placement) classes, Dual Credit classes and the Early College program—a program which allowed Ausbrooks to learn at a college level. Together, the academic opportunities were building blocks in preparing Ausbrooks for success at the collegiate level. Her accomplishments in the classroom also were instrumental as Ausbrooks went through the application and interview processes—steps leading to her selection for the prestigious honor.

“The Singletary interview committee enjoyed meeting you during your interview, and we

are delighted that you are considering the University of Kentucky,” the letter explained to Ausbrooks.

The scholarship is named in honor of Dr. Otis A. Singletary, who served as president of the University of Kentucky from 1971 to 1982. It is considered the university’s highest academic scholarship and is awarded to students who demonstrate exceptional scholarship, leadership and service.

“The University of Kentucky looks forward to seeing Ausbrooks in blue this fall,” added Bryan P. Erslan, executive director of Student Financial Aid and Scholarships.

Ausbrooks’ successful

application process was aided by the support of a family friend.

“We’re also very grateful to Melinda Porter, because without her guidance we may not have known about the Singletary Scholarship or the UK BLUE program, which Katelyn was also accepted into as she pursues her future plans,” added Ausbrooks’ mother, Heather. “We feel that sharing her story could help spread awareness of these opportunities and encourage other AC-SHS students to pursue them in the future.”

Ausbrooks’ career ambition is to become a lawyer. She is the daughter of Heather and Joey Ausbrooks.



Registration Ongoing Until July 1 for Operation Kindergarten at the Allen County Primary Center

Incoming kindergarten students are encouraged to take part in Operation Kindergarten—a five-day camp designed specifically to welcome the newest students to the Allen County Primary Center.

“Registration for Operation Kindergarten is still open for students who do not need bus transportation,” explained Camp Director Whittany Underwood. “Sign-ups for those students will remain open until

July 1. Bus routes have already been finalized, so we are no longer able to add students who require bus transportation.”

Operation Kindergarten will take place from Monday, July 20 through Friday, July 24. Two three-and-a-half hour sessions are held each day.

“Our camp provides a wonderful opportunity for children to become familiar with the school environment, meet new friends, and build foundational skills before the school year begins,”

Underwood added.
