



Allen County Man Arrested In Bowling Green on Several Charges

A man from Allen County has found himself in a lot of trouble in Bowling Green.

According to a uniform citation on June 15 from the Bowling Green Police Department, Jordan A. Napier, 29, of Adolphus, was involved in a disturbance located at 1956 Wiltshire Street, Apartment D in Bowling Green. This took place at 11:40 p.m.

Numerous people called to report they heard gunshots during the disturbance.

When officers arrived on the scene, there were several subjects in the parking lot of the apartment complex, four of whom were detained.

The first victim was identified as a resident of the apartment. As officers were speaking with him, he advised that Napier had arrived at the apartment with his girlfriend to pick up their belongings. He then advised that Napier became upset that his belongings were left outside of the apartment.

That's when the disturbance began.

The victim stated he began fighting with Napier in front of the apartment. He went back into his apartment and closed the door. Napier went to the back door of the apartment. The victim looked out of the window of the back door and saw Napier holding a firearm at the door.

It should be noted that Napier's girlfriend was inside the apartment at this time.

The victim went on to state that Napier threatened to kill him and fired two rounds into the door while he was standing in front of it. The victim began running away from the door and telling Napier's girlfriend to also get away from the door.

According to the victim, his girlfriend was upstairs in the apartment as well along with her child during the shooting while Napier's girlfriend was in the living room.

The gun was described as a black handgun and observed Napier pointing it at the back door.

Officers advised Napier of his Miranda Rights which he waived and agreed to speak with the officers.

While speaking with Napier, his statements changed numerous times. He said he didn't have a firearm and didn't shoot into the back door. He had initially stated he didn't even go to the back of the apartment. However, he later disclosed he was behind the apartment several separate times.

BGPD found two shell casings in the rear of the apartment and two bullet holes in the back door. The bullets had gone through the back door, into the kitchen wall and into a utility room.

Officers then searched Napier and discovered a dollar bill in his pants pocket. They unrolled the bill and found a white, powdery residue on the inside of the bill.

Napier was asked about the dollar bill and the residue, he stated it didn't belong to him and that his friend had left it in the vehicle. He also claimed he was unsure of what the substance was but it was probably some crushed up pills.

Another witness was located in the apartments across the street from the location of the disturbance. She advised that she observed the entire situation and that before she heard the gunshots, she observed a tall, mixed male walk behind the apartment.

The male she described matched Napier's description.

She heard two or three gunshots and Napier run around the apartment back to his vehicle. She said he entered his vehicle, drove away from the apartment and returned approximately two minutes later. He began removing several items from the vehicle and placing them in front of the apartment.

A camera was located across the street at 1949 Wiltshire and confirmed the witness' statements. Napier could be seen on camera going to the rear of the apartment, then running back around the building to the vehicle. He then entered the vehicle, drove away and returned approximately two minutes later.

Napier was placed into custody and transported to the Warren County Regional Jail where he was lodged. He was charged with first-degree wanton endangerment

(discharge of a firearm), first-degree possession of a controlled substance (drug unspecified), second-degree disorderly conduct and third-degree terroristic threatening.

The firearm was not recovered at this time and the dollar bill located on Napier's person was lodged into BGPD evidence to be sent to the Kentucky State Police Lab for testing.

Police Beat
•On Saturday, June 13, Landon J. Nichols, 27, was arrested and charged with alcohol intoxication in a public place and second-degree indecent exposure.

•On Wednesday, June 17, Scottsville Police were dispatched to the Allen County courthouse at 200 West Main Street.

Officers arrived and made contact with Michael J. Fallon, 56. Alcohol emanated from his breath, his speech was slurred and he was unsteady on his feet.

When questioned, Fallon admitted to consuming several shots prior to his arrival for court.

Fallon was arrested and taken to the Allen County Detention Center without incident. He was charged with alcohol intoxication in a public place.

•The following were picked up on active warrants: Randy E. Pilgrim, second-degree fleeing or evading police (motor vehicle); Brandon T. Fisher, probation violation; Devin S. Reece, failure to appear; Norman T. Pinkston, failure to appear; James M. Bilbrey, fugitive from another state, Nicole J. Pressley, failure to appear; Chadrick M. Berry, failure to appear; Bradley McPeak, failure to appear; Kellie J. Nichols, failure to appear; Landon J. Nichols, alcohol intoxication in a public place and second-degree indecent exposure.

Allen County Sheriff's Office Activity

•On Monday, June 15 at 6:45 p.m., deputies observed a silver, 2016 Toyota Corolla traveling south on Veterans Memorial Hwy. driving 82 mph in a 65 mph zone. The speed was confirmed by moving RADAR.

The operator of the vehicle, Atley Jordyn Atwood, 20, of Scottsville, apologized for her speed.

Atwood was cited for speeding 17 mph over the speed limit and issued a court date.

•On Monday, June 15 at 7:04 p.m., deputies observed a white, 2007 Chrysler 300 traveling north on Old Gallatin Road and turn left into the Save-A-Lot parking lot without using the turn signal. A traffic

stop was made. Contact was made with the operator, Joshua D. York, 39, of Smiths Grove. He stated he didn't have a drivers license.

York was asked to exit the vehicle for further questioning.

When asked who the vehicle belonged to, York stated that he and his girlfriend had purchased the vehicle a month prior and had not transferred it into their names because the tag was still current.

Further into the investigation, dispatch advised that York had multiple priors while operating a motor vehicle without a license.

York was placed under arrest and charged with failure to signal, failure to register transfer of a motor vehicle and no operators license. He was lodged in the Allen County Detention Center.

•On Monday, June 15, deputies observed a white, 2004 Honda Pilot traveling south on New Gallatin Road with one operating headlamp. A traffic stop was conducted.

Contact was made with the operator, Joshua C. Richards, 29, of Scottsville. He was unable to provide proof of a current insurance policy.

Richards was cited for one headlight and failure of non-owner/operator to maintain required insurance.

•On Tuesday, June 16 at 7:28 p.m., deputies observed a silver, 2016 Dodge Ram 2500

traveling north on Veterans Memorial Hwy. driving 60 mph in a clearly marked 45 mph zone. Speed was indicated by moving RADAR.

Contact was made with the operator, Isaiah Rafael Barrera, 19, of Lafayette, Tenn. He stated he didn't know the speed limit was 45 mph and he didn't realize he was going fast until he saw the patrol unit.

Barrera was cited for speeding 15 mph over the speed limit and there was no further incident.

•On Tuesday, June 16 at 8:23 p.m., deputies observed a white, 2016 Nissan Sentra traveling east on East Locust Street. NCIC advised unconfirmed on insurance and a traffic stop was conducted.

Contact was made with the operator, Jeffery Neal Tucker, 55, of Scottsville. He couldn't provide proof of insurance on the vehicle and stated it didn't belong to him.

Tucker was cited for failure of non-owner/operator to maintain required insurance and there were no further incidents.

•On Saturday, June 20 at approximately 5:10 a.m., deputies observed a commercial vehicle traveling on Hwy. 101, Smiths Grove Road. The vehicle's width measured 102 inches and the road restriction is 96 inches.

Also the combined length of the truck and trailer measured over 72 feet in length and the restriction is 65 feet.

The driver, Mike Albert Montas, 47, of Pittsburgh, Pa., was cited for over width and over length of a tractor/semi-trailer.

•On Saturday, June 20 at 2:59 p.m., officers advised that Michael W. Harvey, 35, of Bowling Green, may be at the ALCO Apartments through a tip received by an unknown bystander.

Harvey was advised that he had an active EPO against him and he was to stay 500 feet away from the petitioner's address.

Deputies arrived on the scene and the petitioner allowed them access into her apartment. She also advised that Harvey was in her residence.

Harvey was brought out of the residence at gunpoint due to concerns he was armed and dangerous with a knife. That came from information received a day prior.

Harvey was arrested and taken to the Allen County Detention Center.

EMS arrived at the jail and checked on Harvey's foot that he injured prior to being arrested. EMS cleared him prior to being transferred to the jail's custody.

Harvey was charged with violation of a Kentucky EPO/DVO.

•The following were picked up on active warrants: Huston C. Stovall, failure to appear; James E. Coakley, first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) and possession of drug paraphernalia.
