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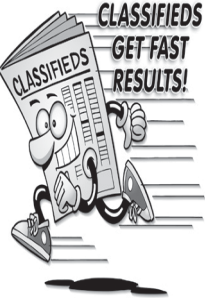

the Cemetery portion of the Tour. Emberton, a historian, wife of Gabe Emberton, and mother of four, earned her doctorate in Technology Leadership and has additional experience in education and library science.

Groups then “depart” for the Cemetery ready to meet the historical characters waiting to make their acquaintance. The “Dearly Returned” are:

•Samuel Garrison, portrayed by Matt Pedigo. Born in Maryland in 1762, Garrison, at just 17 years old, joined the North Carolina Militia and saw action against Loyalist, British and Hessian mercenary forces at the Battle of Stono Ferry. Visitors will hear his stories from the front as well as how, after the war, he and wife Esther moved to what would become Allen County and played a prominent role in the establishment of Scottsville. Garrison’s modern-era descendants have served Scottsville and Allen County, some as first responders.

Pedigo, a San Rafael, Calif., native, graduated Allen County-Scottsville High School in 1987. A 2000 graduate of Western Kentucky University majoring in journalism, Pedigo served as a Bowling Green Daily News reporter before joining The Citizen-Times as editor in 2000. In 2018, he became the newspaper’s owner/publisher. Currently a federal grant specialist with the Barren River Area Development District, Pedigo, a father of two, still lives with wife Kathy and daughter Madison, 18, in northern Allen County’s Meador community. (Daughter Shawnda Owen lives in Bowling Green.)

•Elizabeth Page Motley, portrayed by Lisa Wyman. During the Revolution, Elizabeth’s husband, Captain John Motley, supplied food

and forage to the Patriot cause, and used his riverboat to transport soldiers and supplies. John received a land grant for his service but didn’t settle there; instead, he bought a 105-acre farm in Allen County, with a working gristmill on Bays Fork Creek.

Wyman is a Louisville native with family roots in Allen County. She is a WKU graduate and is employed at Warren County Area Technology Center. Now the Historical Society’s vice president, Wyman and husband Jeff live in the Plano community.

•Rev. James Page Durham, portrayed by Tim Meador. Durham is the grandson of Revolutionary Patriot John Durham, who had joined the Virginia militia in 1781. After the war he and his family settled in Allen County in the community that still bears his name, Durham Springs. James Page Durham served the Union cause in the Civil War, joining the 9th Kentucky Regiment, Company K. He saw action in several battles, including at Missionary Ridge and several other battles; after the war he became a well-known Baptist preacher.

Meador has continued that clergy tradition, as pastor of Bethel Missionary Baptist Church. Meador, a 26-year Scottsville firefighter, is also Allen County’s jailer. He and wife Jennifer have two children, Rachel and Caden.

•John Giles, portrayed by Coe Campbell. A New Jersey native, Giles was living in Rowan County, N.C., when he joined the fight for independence, serving as an orderly sergeant. He moved around after the war, but finally settled in Scottsville. He and his wife are believed to be buried in the City

Cemetery in unmarked graves.

Campbell, a WKU graduate, is working for the campaign of U.S. Senate Candidate Andy Barr (R). Campbell and wife Olivia have a daughter, Amelia, and live in Allen County. Campbell is an avid historian who enjoys discovering and documenting old cemeteries.

•Benjamin Poe, portrayed by Chris Carter. Already dedicated to the Independence movement, Poe had already joined the North Carolina militia in 1775, the year before the Declaration of Independence. He served as a horseman in Randolph County, N.C. Around 1800, his family, along with other related families, came to Allen County, settling in the Puncheon Creek area. These families helped establish a church near the Kentucky-Tennessee border.

Carter, a descendant of Poe, is an AC-S graduate, genealogist and an experienced Revolutionary and Civil War re-enactor. He and his wife, Mary, also a re-enactor and genealogist, reside in southern Allen County on their ancestral family farm. They have two sons, David and Cody, and are also grandparents. Chris works for the City of Westmoreland, Tenn.

•John Gatewood, portrayed by Jimmy Gillenwater. At the age of 17, Gatewood enlisted in the Continental Army. Beginning his duties with guarding prisoners of war, he served five tours in the cause for independence. The last tour may have been his most memorable—at the 1781 Siege of Yorktown, he watched British Gen. Lord Charles Cornwallis surrender his army. After a witnessing that glorious, glorious day for his fledgling country, he later went west to settle in Kentucky. But on the

way, he made a very bad trade, as visitors will learn.

Gillenwater, an AC-S graduate, worked in the electrical maintenance field before retirement. He has been married to his wife Debbie (Kirby) for 40 years. They reside on a cattle farm on West Old State Road and are the parents of Kyle, Katherine and Kristine.

•Helen Gilmore Smith Thomas and Lottie Gilmore Guy, portrayed by real-life sisters Suzanne Guy Alexander and Janet Guy Cropper.

“History isn’t just found in books; it’s in our blood, our names, and the very ground we walk on,” Wood said.

Thomas’ story begins with Patrick Gillmore, born in colonial Virginia in 1753. When liberty called, Patrick answered, serving the Continental Army extensively. In the early 1800s, the family migrated to Kentucky, establishing enduring roots.

In 1919, Lottie Gillmore Guy married Charlie Guy, descended from Patriot William Guy. Around 1795, William and his family moved west to Trammel Creek in what is now Allen County. They were farmers; members of the Guy family are still farming some of the same land today.

The descendant sisters portraying them grew up living and working on the Guy family farm. Both graduated from AC-S. Now retired after serving with the Federal Aviation Administration, Suzanne enjoys living on a farm in Fulton County, Ky. Janet retired from Justice Realty and lives in Lexington, Ky. She now plans activities for the assisted living
