-Earlier this season, the Danville Admirals posted a 9-5 victory over the Somerset Briar Jumpers in the championship game of the 12th Regional All "A" Baseball Tournament. Last night at West Jessamine High School, it was the Admirals turning in an "A" performance against Somerset, in the granddaddy of regional tournaments. ... Danville rolled to a 6-0 victory over the Briar Jumpers, claiming the 12th Regional Baseball Tournament. ... With the loss, Somerset ended its season with a 25-12 record, but all is not lost for fans of the purple and gold. The Jumpers did not have one senior in the field last night in the regional title game, as Grundy started six sophomores, two juniors, and a freshman. So, with all of this youth on the roster, the Briar Jumpers could very well be poised to make a run at a regional title for the next couple of

years, something head coach Phil Grundy is certainly aiming at. ... (Somerset) placed three players on the 12th Regional Tournament All-Tournament Team. (Local) members were as follows: Brandon Hranicky — Southwestern, Jordy Molen — Somerset, Corey Price — Somerset, and John Cole — Somerset.

-Pulaski distance runners Patrick Jenkins and Laska Sneed turned in strong

performances in the Class AAA state track meet in Lexington, Ky. this past weekend. Jenkins would finish fifth in the 3200-meter run with a time of 9 minutes 48.7 seconds. ... In the girls 800-meter race, Sneed would place sixth with a time of 2 minutes 23.9 seconds. ... Pulaski's Todd Miller placed seventh in the Class AAA 110-meter hurdles with a time of 16.26 seconds. Miller would also finish 10th in the high jump with a best height of 5 feet 8 inches. Southwestern's Dustin Fothergill placed 10th in the long jump with a best of 20 feet 3.75 inches and the placed 14th in the triple jump with a best of 39 feet 11.75 inches. Southwestern's Trevor Jones placed 11th in the Class AAA 1600-meter run with a time of 4 minutes 40.5 seconds. In the girls' Class AAA pole vault event, Southwestern's Kotey Crowe placed 13th with a best height of 7 feet 6 inches. ... Pulaski's Denetta Hale finished 15th in the girls Class AAA 3200-meter run with a time of 13 minutes 14.2 seconds. Southwestern's 320g meter relay team — Trevor Jones, Jacob Belwood, Jason Briones, and Sabastian Rhode — finished 12th with a time of 8 minutes 33.1 seconds. Pulaski's 3200-meter relay

team — Chase Dobbs, Kirk Jenkins, Patrick Jenkins and Jonathon Moore — finished 15th with a time of 9 minutes 3.3 seconds. Pulaski County finished 28th in the boys standings with 6 points. ... The Pulaski girls finished 35th with 3 points. ...In the Class A division, Somerset's Adam Joplin finished 10th in the 1600 meter run with a time of 4 minutes 52.5 seconds.

-The Cal Ripken II & 12-year-old A's improved their record to 10-0 last week by defeating the Padres and the Rangers. ... For the A's (against the Padres,) Jared Price was 2 for 3 with a homerun and 2 RBI's, Zack Turpin was 1 for 2 with a homerun and an RBI, Taylor Speaks was 2 for 2 with an RBI, Braden McWilliams was 1 for 4 with 2 RBI's and Kent Dalton was 1 for 3 with 2 RBI's. 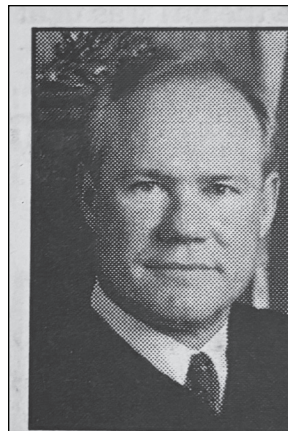

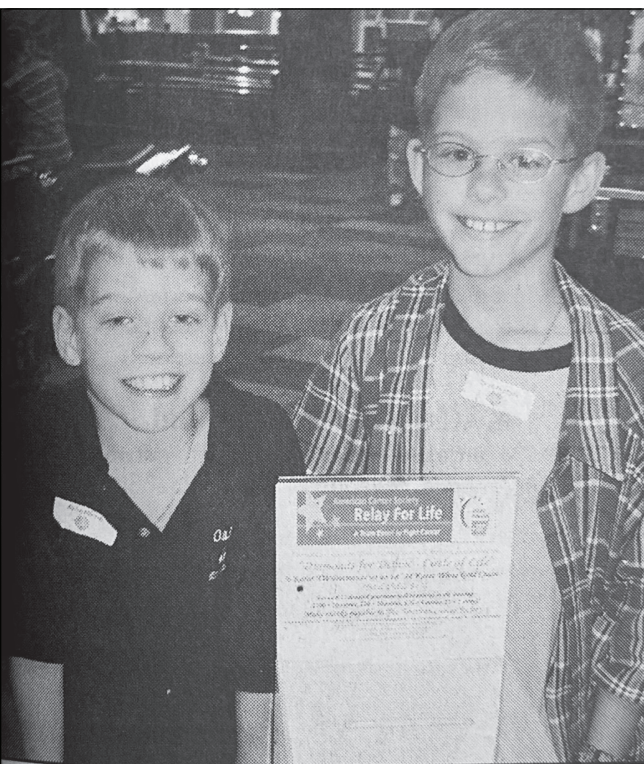
