market has success written all over it," commented Janet Eaton, farmers' market specialist with the Kentucky Department of Agriculture.

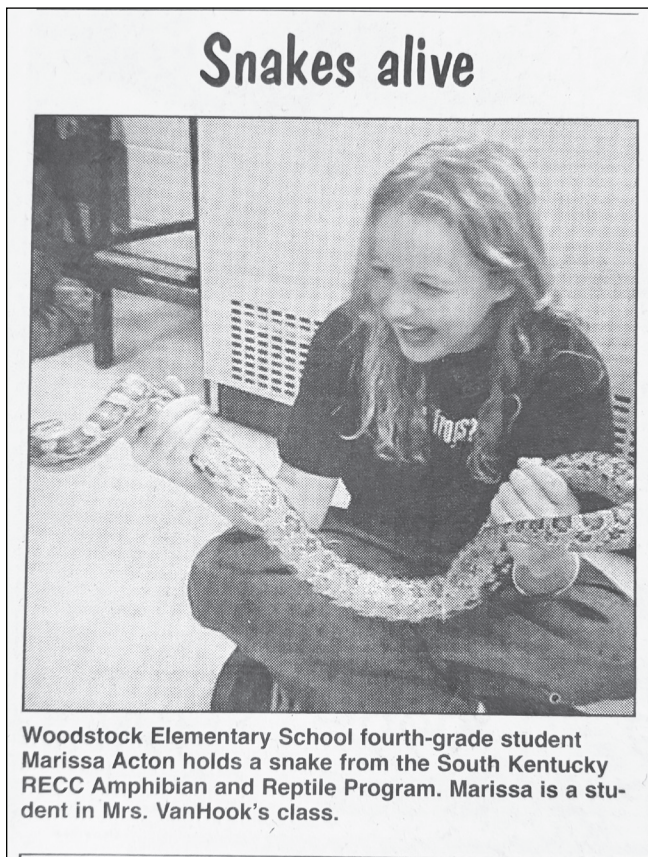
## SCHOOL NEWS:

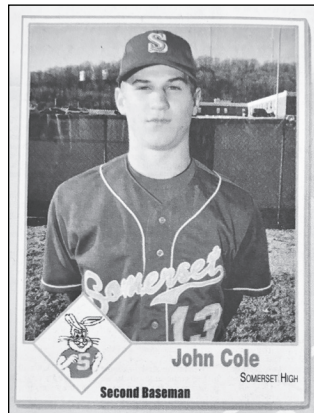

### AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE CITY OF EUBANK, KENTUCKY ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR

07/01/2026 THROUGH 06/30/2027

### BY ESTIMATING REVENUES AND RESOURCES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF CITY GOVERNMENT

WHEREAS, an annual budget proposal and message has been prepared and delivered to the City/ Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City/ Commission has reviewed such budget proposal and made necessary modifications,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF EUBANK, KENTUCKY.

SECTION 1: That the annual budget for the fiscal year beginning 07/01/2026 and ending 06/30/2027 is hereby adopted as follows:
