-The Somerset 13-year-old Babe Ruth All-Stars won the District Five Championship Saturday, as they routed Lebanon 13-4 in the title game at the GE Field. With the victory, the Somerset 13-year-old stars advanced to the state tournament, which begins August 1. Chris Hail, the starting pitcher, and reliever Bo Bobbitt teamed up to throw a one-hitter for the Somerset stars. Somerset, meanwhile, banged out 15 hits, four of them by Troy Tucker, who had two doubles and two singles. Kelly Sheehan added a double and two singles, and Bobbitt had a double and single.

-The Pulaski County Little League All-Stars advanced to the semifinal round of the Area Four Tournament last night, as they downed the McCreary County All-Stars 4-1 at the GE Field. Center fielder Lori Hines led the way for Pulaski with a solo homer and a double, accounting for two of her team's three hits (the other was a single by Ronnie Estes). Hines' homer over the left field fence in the fourth inning (her first homer all year) broke up a scoreless tie. Pitcher Roger Redmond of Pulaski fanned six and walked two.

-Billy Miller of Nancy High, the leading scorer in Pulaski County this past season, has signed to play basketball this coming year at Somerset Community College. Miller, a 6-4 center-forward, averaged 25.9 points per game for coach Avery Hatfield's Nancy Dragons during the 1975-76 season. He made state basketball history when he chalked up 90 points in a single game against Pine Knot — the second-highest one-game total ever recorded in Kentucky.
