Celebrate World Milk Day on June 1 and National Dairy Month during June.

National Dairy Month started out as a way to distribute extra milk during the warm months of summer. The commemoration was established in 1937 by grocer organizations sponsoring "National Milk Month." By 1939, June became the official "dairy month."

Dairy is a business established for the harvesting or processing (or both) of animal milk – mostly from cows but also can be goats, sheep, etc.

Dairy farming is a large global industry with approximately 270 million dairy cows in the world. Milk production takes place

all over the world.

Whether it's in coffee, cereal, or smoothies, adding one more serving of milk to your family's day can help ensure they get the nutrients they need to build strong bones and teeth. Trusted for decades, dairy farm families pride themselves on producing wholesome dairy foods that help their families grow up strong and healthy.

Assistance Available for '26 Livestock Forage Losses

Producers in Cumberland County are eligible to apply for 2026 Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP) benefits

LFP provides compensation if you suffer grazing losses for covered livestock due to drought on privately owned or cash leased land or fire on federally managed land.

County committees can only accept LFP applications after notification is received by the National Office

of qualifying drought or if a federal agency prohibits producers from grazing normal permitted livestock on federally managed lands due to qualifying fire. You must complete a CCC-853 and the required supporting documentation no later than March 1, 2027, for 2026 losses.

All eligible grazing acres must be reported by July 15, 2026.

Being the same property conveyed to Sharon Kaye Wolfe, Divorced, by a deed recorded May 5, 1999 in Deed Book 102, Page 166 and recorded in Cumberland County Clerk's Office.
