The Harrison County Fillies improved to 15-4 on the year with a 13-1 (5 inning) victory over the Nicholas County Lady Jackets on the Hilltop on Monday night.

The Fillies scored in the bottom of the first inning. With one out, Bella Persinger doubled to centerfield. Breckyn Bramel came in as a courtesy runner for Persinger. Bramel stole third and then scored on a groundout by Shyanne Ross to give the Fillies a 1-0 lead after one inning.

Nicholas County tied things up with an unearned run in the top of the second inning. The Fillies were retired in order in the bottom of the second inning and the score remained 1-1 after two innings.

Bella Persinger singled to centerfield. Bramel once again came on as a courtesy runner for Persinger. Bramel stole second and scored when Ross doubled to left field to make the score 4-1. Aleigha Newby walked with Ross advancing to third base on a wild pitch. Newby advanced to second base on defensive indifference.

Rhyllie Walls singled, scoring Ross with Newby moving to third to give the Fillies a 5-1 lead. Walls moved to second on defensive indifference and Newby

scored on a throwing error to put the Fillies up 6-1 with Walls moving to third base. Lexie Highlander walked and moved to second on defensive indifference.

ESPN rolls out WrestleMania 42 big coverage on app

As it does with any championship, ESPN is giving WrestleMania the big-event treatment.

The network will have coverage on "SportsCenter" beginning Thursday, and "First Take" will originate from Allegiant Stadium in Las Vegas on Friday.

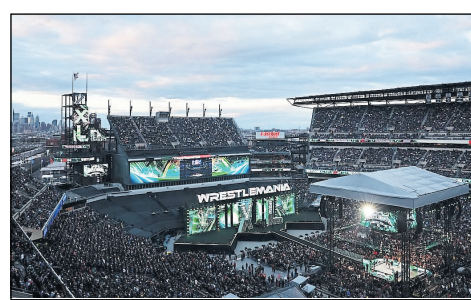
WrestleMania 42 takes place on Saturday and Sunday, and will be streamed on the ESPN app for the first time. However, the opening hour on Saturday will air on ESPN2, while Sunday's first hour will air on ESPN. The start time for both nights is 6 p.m. EDT.

ESPN began airing WWE premium live events on the ESPN Unlimited streaming service last September. Most major cable, satellite, and streaming services have reached agreements with Disney that include an ESPN Unlimited subscription as a part of their TV plan.

"We think about WrestleMania as a major milestone for us. We've never had it before. It's really a slice of Americana and a cultural spectacle that extends well beyond just core wrestling fans. So we thought it deserved the big-event treatment," ESPN president of content Burke Magnus said.

ESPN took over streaming WWE's major events from Peacock, which had carried them since March 2021.

A "WrestleMania 42" preview show will air Friday at 5 p.m. EDT on ESPN2, while countdown shows leading into both nights

will be on either ESPN or ESPN2. The ESPN app will also air Friday night's WWE Hall of Fame ceremony.

This will mark the first time part of the main card will air on linear television. The first WrestleMania took place in 1985 at Madison Square Garden in New York.

"We love that the first hour of each night will be on ESPN linear," said WWE EVP for talent relations Chris Legentil. "It gives us the chance to highlight some of our best stuff and then let people switch over to the app for the rest of the evening. We see ourselves as the underdog, and so we always relish the opportunity to showcase our product in a new way to new people."

Undisputed WWE champion Cody Rhodes defends his title against Randy Orton in the main event on Saturday. WrestleMania concludes Sunday night with CM Punk putting his World Heavyweight title on the line against Roman Reigns.

three tallies in the fifth frame.

A trio of pitchers for the Breds kept the Lions in check. Senior Cooper Slade, 8th-grader Keaton Custard and freshman Walker Courtney combined for the shutout by limiting Lewis Co. to only six singles while striking out eight and walking just two batters. The Lions never got a runner past second base.

Senior Blake Green began the bottom of the first inning with a solid base hit down the left field line after which a walk to Slade put runners on first and second with senior Sean Vaughn taking Slade's place on first base as a courtesy runner. With senior Donovan Walker at the plate, Harrison Co. attempted a double steal. Lewis Co. junior catcher Parker Jordan tried to throw Green out at third base but his toss sailed over


the third baseman's glove allowing Green to score with Vaughn advancing to third. One out later, sophomore Russ Persinger bounced an RBI groundout to the right side of the infield giving the Breds a 2-0 lead.

Harrison Co. tacked on another run in the third frame. With one out, Slade ripped a triple down the right field line. Walker then doubled on a hit that was just fair as it rocketed past the first baseman bringing Vaughn, who had come in to run for Slade, across the dish for a 3-0 advantage.

For all intent and purposes, the Breds put the game away with three

more runs coming home in the fifth inning. Green reached second base leading off the frame when the third baseman for Lewis Co. misplayed a grounder. Slade followed with an RBI base knock into right center field that plated Green. After 8th-grader Easton Reynolds came in to run for Slade, Walker singled to right field. Persinger followed with an RBI base hit that sent Reynolds home. One out later, sophomore Brock Coy picked up an RBI when he blooped a one-bagger into left field setting the final score at 6-0.

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

INSPECTION PERIOD FOR THE PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENT ROLL

The Harrison County real property tax roll will be opened for inspection from May 4 through May 18, 2026. Under supervision of the property valuation administrator or one of the deputies, any person may inspect the tax roll.

This is the January 1, 2026, assessment of which state, county, and school taxes for 2026 will be due from October 1, 2026 through December 31, 2026.

The tax roll is in the office of the property valuation administrator in the Court House, 111 S. Main St., Suite 101, and may be inspected between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday; and on Saturdays during the inspection period by appointment only. We recommend conducting conferences via phone or email. Our office number is 859-234-7133 and/or please email the administrator at allen.darnell@ky.gov. Inspection may be made in the office of the Harrison County PVA.

Any taxpayer desiring to appeal an assessment on real property made by the PVA must first request a conference with the PVA or a designated deputy. The conference may be held prior to or during the inspection period.

Any taxpayer still aggrieved by an assessment on real property after the conference with the PVA or designated deputy, may appeal to the county board of assessment appeals.

The appeal must be filed with the county clerk's office no later than one working day following the conclusion of the inspection period.

A taxpayer failing to appeal to the county board of assessment appears, or failing to appear before the board, either in person or by designated representative, will not be eligible to appeal to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.

Appeals of personal property assessments shall not be made to the county board of assessment appeals. Personal property taxpayers shall be served notice under the provisions of KRS 132.450(4) and shall have the protest and appeal rights granted under the provisions of KRS 131.110.


The following steps should be taken when a taxpayer does not agree with the assessed value of personal property as determined by the property valuation administrator.

- Taxpayer must list under protest (for certification) what he believes to be the fair cash value of his property.
- Taxpayer must file a written protest directly with the Department of Revenue, Office of Property Valuation within 30 days from the date of the notice of assessment.
- This protest must be in accordance with KRS 131.110.

The final decision of the Department of Revenue may be appealed to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.
