We took a lot of pictures this summer. We picked 100.
On Sunday, Oct. 18 at 6 p.m., Boyd's Station is taking over the big screen at the Rohs Opera House for an evening of photographs, stories and conversation about Harrison County. Admission is free.
For three months, Project 306.36 photographers Lylee Gibbs and Maddie McCuddy have been out there — at ballgames and fairs, on farms and back roads, in homes and businesses, and just about everywhere in between — getting to know Harrison County and the people who call it home.
Along the way, they were joined by Pulitzer Prize-winning photojournalist and former Louisville Courier Journal photographer Pat McDonogh, who spent time in Harrison County making his own photographs while also working alongside and mentoring Lylee and Maddie.

Now all three are coming together to show us what they saw.
We'll put 100 photographs on the big screen at the Rohs Opera House and spend the evening talking about the people, places, moments and stories behind them.
You might recognize a place. You might recognize a neighbor. You might even recognize yourself.
And while we're only showing 100 photographs, they're part of something much bigger — Boyd's Station's growing visual archive documenting Harrison County as it is today and preserving these photographs and stories for generations to come.

100 photographs. Three photographers. One big screen. One Harrison County. Come see your community on the big screen.

EPA drops rules limiting power plant emissions

WASHINGTON — The Environmental Protection Agency said Monday it is repealing rules that limit planet-warming greenhouse gas emissions from power plants fueled by coal and natural gas and announced it is taking a separate but related step to prevent future administrations from regulating climate pollution from power plants.

The rule change, first proposed last year, represents a fundamental shift from efforts by Democratic Presidents Joe Biden and Barack Obama to address climate change and regulate carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases that trap the sun's heat.
Environmental groups decried the change, saying it would come at a cost to Americans' health and further degrade the environment.

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING AN AD VALOREM TAX ON ALL MOTOR VEHICLES AND WATERCRAFT BY HARRISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY FOR THE YEAR 2027

Be it ordained by the Fiscal Court of the county of Harrison, Commonwealth of Kentucky:

1. That the ad valorem tax rate for the year of 2027 is hereby fixed at 12.9 cents on each and every \$100.00 worth of motor vehicles and watercraft, as assessed by the property valuation administrator as of January 1, 2027, subject to taxes for County purposes,
2. All taxes levied herein shall be for the General Fund, for the general expenses of Harrison County, Kentucky, and the above taxes levied shall not be used for any other purposes than that for which they are levied.
3. This Ordinance shall take effect as of January 1, 2027 after its passage,

approval and publication as required by law.
