The Edmonson County Board of Education is proposing a general fund tax levy of 49.5 cents on real property and 49.5 cents on personal property.

The General Fund tax levied in fiscal year 2026 was 45.9 cents on real property and 45.9 cents on personal property and produced revenue of \$4,854,255.84. The proposed General Fund tax rate of 49.5 cents on real property and 49.5 cents on personal property is expected to produce \$5,720,721. Of this amount, \$421,588 is from new and personal property. The compensating tax for 2027 is 44.7 cents on real property and 44.8 cents on personal property and is expected to produce \$5,166,528.45.

The proposed rate is expected to generate more revenue than received in the preceding year. The general areas to which revenue of \$866,465 above 2026 revenue is to be allocated are as follows: Cost of collections, \$19,062; building fund, \$723,370; instruction, \$124,033.

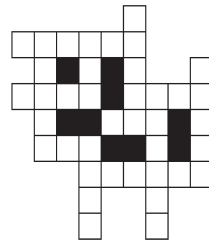

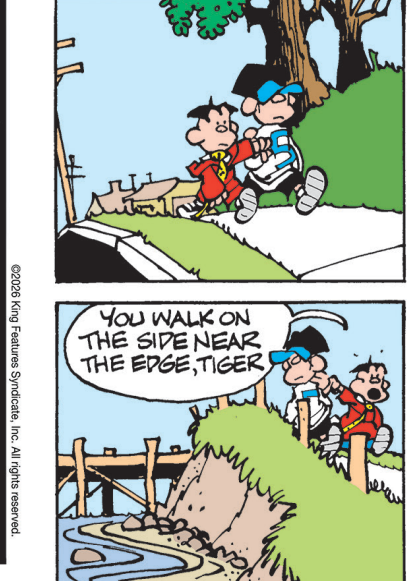

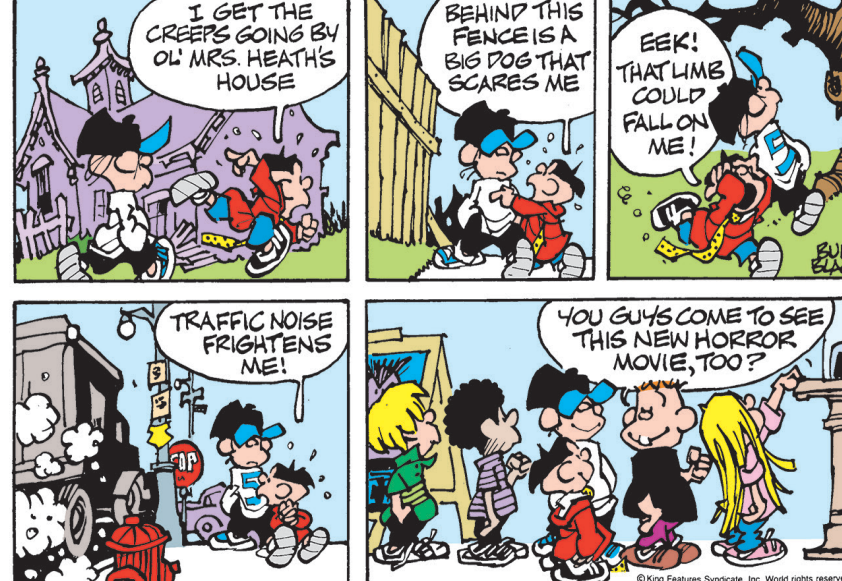
