 Notice is hereby given that the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("PSC") will conduct a public hearing in Case No. 2025-00365 beginning at 9:00 a.m. Eastern Standard Time on Tuesday, June 30, 2026, at the PSC's offices at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601. The purpose of the hearing is to cross-examine Kentucky Power's witnesses and take evidence on Kentucky Power's application for continuation through December 31, 2026 of its demand-side management programs; recovery of costs, including lost revenues and incentives, associated with demand-side management; and all other required approvals and relief. This hearing will be streamed live and may be viewed by connecting to the YouTube link posted on the PSC website, psc.ky.gov, on the day of the hearing.
