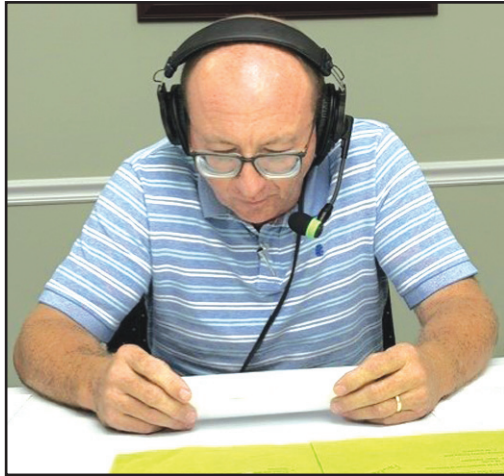
toiletries. Each unit has its own outdoor fire pit and grill.

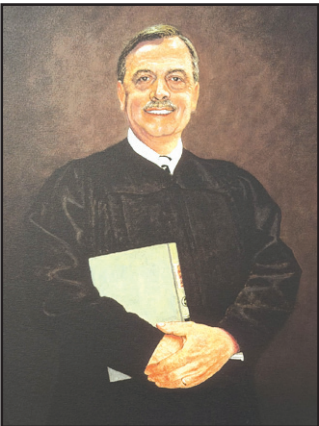

ROBERT I. GALLENSTEIN



Judge Robert I. Gallenstein, 82, of Maysville, died on August 6, 2026, surrounded by friends and family. Judge Gallenstein was born on November 19, 1943, to the late George LeRoy and Margaret O'Rourke Gallenstein.

He received his Bachelor of Science in Foreign Service degree from Georgetown University in Washington, D.C., and his Juris Doctor from the University of Kentucky College of Law. After graduating from law school, he "received greetings from Lyndon Johnson" and set off for the first of two tours in Vietnam, where he was commissioned as a Captain in the Judge Advocate General Corps. He was awarded two Bronze Stars and the Army Commendation Medal (second oak leaf cluster). Judge Gallenstein then returned to Maysville to practice law. In 1973, he became the first Public Defender in Mason County, and in 1978, after the General Assembly wisely created a new position just for him, he was appointed as the first District Judge for the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit. Thus began a long and storied career on the

bench. Judge Gallenstein served as District Judge from 1978 to 1996, when he was elected Circuit Judge, a position he held until he retired in 2002. He was a lifetime fellow of the Kentucky Bar Foundation. Judge Gallenstein was a dedicated public servant who always sought to do justice for those who appeared before him.

Judge Gallenstein is survived by his sons, Robert Nicholas (Kristen) of Maysville, Donald Chanslor (Kayla Shanahan) of Washington, D.C., and Benjamin Wood of Maysville. He is also survived by his two granddaughters, Madly and Kaylen; fifteen siblings, LeRoy (Lottie), Buddy (Alice Kay), Billy, Libby (Charlie Traxel), Henrietta, Bernadine (J.T. Whaley), Fr. Steve, Barbara (Jim Finch), Regina (Bill Case), Dorothy, Greg, Maurita (Roger Owens), Generose (John Klee), Norbert (Jackie), and Fr. Joe; dozens of nieces and nephews; and his brother-in-law Taylor (Karen) Wood.

Besides his parents, Judge Gallenstein was preceded in death by his loving wife, Katherine Lansdale Wood, his father-in-law, Donald L. Wood, and several

brothers- and sisters-in-law.

The family would like to extend its sincerest thanks to those who were with Judge Gallenstein around the clock for the last several years, with special thanks to Roger and Maurita Owens and the staff of Kenton Pointe for their love, support, and friendship.

Judge Gallenstein's visitation will be at Saint Patrick Church from 4:00–8:00 p.m. on Friday, August 14. Mass of Christian Burial will be held at Saint Patrick Church at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, August 15. Burial will follow at Washington Baptist Cemetery. Pallbearers will be John Estill, Kelly Caudill, Stockton Wood, Jeff Schumacher, Jamie Whaley, and Robert Klee. Honorary pallbearers will be members of the Mason County Bar Association.

Most Rowan County elected Officials and their staffs, have earned our respect, trust, and appreciation.
