Warsaw to raze condemned Roberts property on Sparta Pike

Code Enforcement Officer Brent Caldwell addressed Monday's Warsaw City Council meeting about Loren Roberts's dilapidated property at 513 Sparta Pike.

Caldwell told council he has received a bid from Larry Lewis to demolish the condemned house at a cost of \$5,000. Jay Puckett has offered to tow the two vehicles parked in the yard. Caldwell said it would cost the city another \$5,000 for dumpsters, and other work to complete the project. The house and surrounding property is a hazard to residents and pedestrians and affects neighboring property values.

At Caldwell's request, council unanimously approved an emergency budget amendment to fund the demolition with \$10,000 from the city's general fund.

•The city has hired Mike Meyer as an officer at the Warsaw Police Department. Former officer Cameron Nieswander, who fulfilled his three-year contract with the city, has left Warsaw to join the Carrollton Police Department.

•Mayor C.E. French praised officer Amin El Brahmi who has "knocked it out of the park" during his time with the WPD.

•French emphasized that the Community Forum development meeting, held Tuesday, January 13, was only to make plans for infrastructure projects. He said the meeting was scheduled in October by the Northern Kentucky
