Ephraim McDowell Regional Medical Center Announces Temporary Parking and Traffic Changes Ahead of Construction

As preparations begin for upcoming construction projects at Ephraim McDowell Regional Medical Center, patients and visitors will notice temporary changes to Outpatient Pharmacy parking and traffic patterns beginning August 10.

To accommodate construction activities, the current 15-minute Outpatient Pharmacy pickup parking spaces located in front of the Main Entrance on South Third Street will be temporarily unavailable for approximately two months.

New designated parking locations for Outpatient Pharmacy patients will include:

15-minute Outpatient Pharmacy parking along Martin Luther King Boulevard, immediately to the right after turning from South Third Street, providing convenient access for quick prescription pickup.

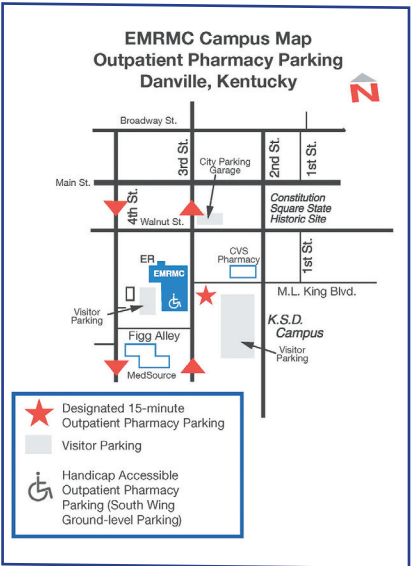
Accessible (handicap) Outpatient Pharmacy

parking under the drive-through canopy on the south end of the campus near Figg Alley for patients requiring accessible access.

Patients and visitors are encouraged to watch for new directional signage that will guide them to the designated parking areas.

In addition to the parking changes, South Third Street will transition to one lane of traffic as crews begin preparing the campus for construction. Motorists should expect minor delays and use caution while traveling through the area.
