

Garrard County Falls to Danville, 5-1, in Home Match

Garrard County's boys varsity soccer team battled Danville High School on Thursday, Sept. 10, but the Golden Lions were unable to slow a productive Admirals attack in a 5-1 loss at Garrard County High School Stadium in Lancaster.

The defeat moved Garrard County to 3-8 on the season, while Danville improved to 7-1-3.

Garrard County goalkeeper Mikie Leger faced steady pressure throughout the match. Leger recorded seven saves

while allowing five goals, finishing with a .583 save percentage. The numbers indicate Danville generated 12 shots on goal, forcing Leger to make several stops to keep Garrard County within reach.

Danville's scoring was led by Alexander Terrell, who finished with two goals and an assist. Malachi Snyder and Alex Finke each added a goal, while Brayden Cline recorded an assist. The available individual offensive statistics account for four of Danville's five goals.

Garrard County managed to break through for one goal against Danville goalkeeper

Dawson Gover. Gover was credited with three saves and one goal allowed, giving him a .750 save percentage. That indicates the Golden Lions put four shots on goal during the match.

Although Garrard County was outscored by four goals, Leger's seven saves prevented Danville from adding further to its advantage. The Golden Lions finished the night with their eighth loss of the season as they continued through their varsity schedule with a 3-8 record.

Garrard County Blanks Madison Southern 2-0 Behind Weaver's 16-Save Shutout

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Garrard County High School earned a 2-0 road victory over Madison Southern High School in girls varsity soccer Monday evening at Madison Southern Stadium in Berea.

The win improved Garrard County's record to 6-1-2, while Madison Southern fell to 3-5-1.

Garrard County received goals from Meredith Bailey and Devin Delucia, providing all the scoring needed in a match high-

lighted by a strong defensive performance. Paisley Poynter also contributed offensively, recording two shots on goal.

The decisive performance came in goal from Claire Weaver. Facing sustained pressure from Madison Southern, Weaver made 16 saves and did not allow a goal, finishing with a 1.000 save percentage. Her shutout preserved Garrard County's two-goal advantage despite Madison Southern generating numerous opportunities on target.

Garrard County finished with two goals on six recorded shots, while its defense and goalkeeping kept Madison Southern off the scoreboard throughout the contest.

The result gave Garrard County its sixth victory of the season and extended a strong opening stretch in which the team had suffered just one loss through its first nine matches. Madison Southern, meanwhile, left its home field with its fifth defeat of the season.

SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE

At meetings held on August 20, 2026 and September 8, 2026, the City Council of the City of Lancaster, Kentucky (referred to herein as the "Lessee") duly adopted an ordinance (the "Ordinance") titled as follows:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LANCASTER, KENTUCKY APPROVING A LEASE AGREEMENT FOR THE FINANCING OF A PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF AND SECURITY FOR THE LEASE; ESTABLISHING A SINKING FUND; AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF VARIOUS DOCUMENTS RELATED TO THE LEASE.

The Ordinance provides for the authorization of a lease agreement (the "Lease") to be entered into by and between the Lessee and the Kentucky Bond Corporation (the "Lessor") for the purposes of financing the costs of the design, acquisition, and installation of new LED lighting fixtures for four athletic fields at the Jaycees Ballpark. The Ordinance contains provisions that provide for (i) a general obligation pledge of the Lessee to levy and assess sufficient taxes to comply with its obligation to pay lease rental payments to the Lessor under the Lease, and (ii) the establishment of a sinking fund to be pledged as additional security for the payment of lease rental payments and certain other obligations of the Lessee under the Lease. As required under KRS Section 83A.060, the section of the Ordinance containing the Lessee's pledge to levy and assess a tax to pay the obligations under the Lease is set forth in its entirety:

"Section 3. **General Obligation Pledge.** In accordance with the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, including, particularly, Sections 66.011 through 66.191, inclusive, of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, as amended (the "General Obligation Act"), the obligation of the Lessee to pay the Lease Rental Payments under (and as defined in) the Lease shall constitute a full general obligation of the Lessee, and the full faith, credit, and taxing power of the Lessee are hereby pledged for the prompt payment of such Lease Rental Payments. During the period that the Lease is outstanding, there shall be and there hereby is levied, annually, on all taxable property in the Lessee, in addition to all other taxes, without limitation as to rate, a direct tax in an amount sufficient to pay such Lease Rental Payments as and when due and payable, it being hereby found and determined that the current tax rates of the Lessee are within all applicable limitations. Such tax shall be, and hereby is, ordered to be computed, certified, levied, and extended upon the tax duplicate, and shall be collected by the same officers, in the same manner, and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of the years are certified, extended, and collected. Such tax shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof; provided, however, that in each year, to the extent that any other lawfully available funds of the Lessee are available for payment of the Lease Rental Payments and are appropriated for such purpose, the amount of such tax on all taxable property in the Lessee shall be reduced by the amount of such other funds so available and appropriated."

The undersigned, as City Clerk of the City of Lancaster, Kentucky, hereby certifies that the Ordinance summarized herein was approved by the City Council of the Lessee for first reading on August 20, 2026, and second reading on September 8, 2026, and was further approved for publication following its adoption, according to law. A complete copy of the Ordinance may be reviewed at the office of the City of Lancaster, Kentucky.

Garrard County Powers Past Danville for 3-1 Home Victory

Garrard County High School's girls varsity soccer team continued its strong start to the season Thursday night, earning a 3-1 victory over Danville High School at Garrard County High School Stadium in Lancaster.

The win improved Garrard County's record to 5-1-2, while Danville fell to 5-5. Garrard produced the greater attacking output in the matchup, finishing with seven shots and getting all three of its goals from Ava Warren and Danaca Smith.

Warren led the Golden Lions' attack with two goals and an assist. The No. 10 accounted for

five of Garrard County's seven shots, making her the central figure in an offense that found enough openings to build a two-goal advantage.

Smith supplied the other goal for Garrard County. She scored once on two shots, giving the Golden Lions multiple scoring threats and helping the home side finish with three goals despite Danville's efforts to stay within reach.

Garrard County also received an important contribution in goal from Claire Weaver. The goalkeeper recorded three saves while allowing one goal, finishing with a .750 save percentage. Danville registered four shots on goal, but Weaver and the Garrard defense prevented the

Admirals from turning most of those opportunities into goals.

June Goodwin provided Danville's lone goal. She finished with two shots and put both on goal. Ally Schommer and Cymia Johnson were also credited with shots on goal, while Abigail Pennington recorded one shot.

The victory gave Garrard County its fifth win of the season and kept the Golden Lions' strong early-season record intact. With Warren and Smith supplying the scoring and Weaver limiting Danville at the other end, Garrard County turned a balanced performance into a 3-1 home result.
