CITY OF STAMPING GROUND ORDINANCE NO 2026-001
AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO COMPENSATION OF THE MAYOR, MAYOR PRO TEM AND CITY COMMISSIONERS
Be it enacted by the Stamping Ground City Commission as follows:
Section 1. Stamping Ground City Ordinance Section 31.02(E) is hereby amended as follows:
The compensation of each Commissioner is hereby set by ordinance per regular, special or emergency meeting attended by such Commissioner. Effective January 1, 2027 the compensation

for each Commissioner is set as \$100.00 per regular, special, or emergency meeting attended by the Commissioner.
Section 2. Stamping Ground City Ordinance Section 31.02(F) is hereby amended as follows:
The compensation of the Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem is hereby set by ordinance per regular, special or emergency meeting attended by the Mayor or Mayor Pro Tem. Effective January 1, 2027 the compensation for the Mayor is set as \$150.00 per regular, special, or emergency meeting attended by the Mayor. Effective January 1, 2027 the compensation

for the Mayor Pro Tem is set as \$125.00 per regular, special, or emergency meeting attended by the Mayor Pro Tem.
Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication.
