With a long pass from half field, Alyssa Brown found Gambrell on the Rebels' backline. Gambrell and Wittich then 1-2 passed through the remaining defenders, closing in on the goal. Off a short pass from Wittich, Gambrell scored her second goal as Grant reinforced their lead.

Riding this success, the Lady Braves kept up the pressure, pushing deep into the Rebels' back line. Following three saved shots, the Rebels counter-attacked as the goalie punted the ball past half-field.

Caught off guard, the Lady Braves made a costly mistake as a failed clearance positioned a Rebels striker with a wide-open shot. Boone didn't waste their second chance of the half, with the goal making it 2-1.

Grant now went on the defensive. Across the remaining minutes of the half, Payten Rodgers made three saves in goal as the Lady Braves' grasp on the lead stood firm. While Grant eventually began to rebuild its offense, they limped their way into half-time with a narrowed lead.

Coming out of the break, however, the reinvigorated Grant sought to restore their offensive prowess. In only two minutes, the Lady Braves demonstrated lethal scoring potential as Brown crossed the ball into Sanford for a goal.

At 3-1, Grant wasn't finished with the Rebels as Kayden Brown swiftly intercepted Boone's kickoff. The Lady Braves'

CITY OF CRITTENDEN ORDINANCE NO. 354-2026

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AND MAKING THE REAL PROPERTY, PERSONAL PROPERTY, MOTOR VEHICLE AND WATERCRAFT TAX LEVY FOR CITY PURPOSES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2026 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2027 INCLUSIVE.

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Crittenden, Kentucky, is required by KRS 92.280 to enact by ordinance each year, a tax levy on all real property, personal property, motor vehicles and watercraft; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF CRITTENDEN, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE

That the following tax levy is hereby made for City purposes for the City of Crittenden, Kentucky, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, inclusive, to wit:
There is hereby made a tax levy of point one sixty seven (0.167) on each one hundred dollars (\$1 00.00) of assessed real property subject to ad valorem tax by the City of Crittenden and point one seven seven (0.177) on each one hundred dollars (\$1 00.00) of assessed personal property subject to ad valorem tax by the City of Crittenden of all personal property subject to ad valorem taxation by the City of Crittenden, the proceeds of which shall be designated to the General Fund for the general operation of City Government.

SECTION TWO

All matters relating to the payment of the taxes imposed on motor vehicles and watercraft hereunder shall be in accordance with KRS Chapter 134.800 et seq.

SECTION THREE

The taxes imposed hereby shall be due and payable before the 1st day of January 2027, at the Office of the City Clerk of the City of Crittenden, 117 South Main Street, Crittenden, Kentucky 41030, and shall be delinquent on January 1, 2027. If paid on or prior to November 15, 2026, there shall be a Two (2%) Percent discount. On and after January 1, 2027, there shall be added thereto an interest penalty of Ten (10%) per annum from January 1, 2027, until paid, plus the cost of collection including court costs and attorney's fees.

SECTION FOUR

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such infirmity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

SECTION FIVE

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION SIX

This ordinance shall take effect after its passage and publication according to law.

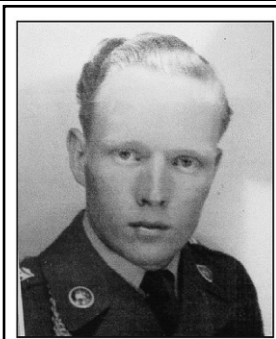
