KSP Post 4 conducts traffic checkpoints

Kentucky State Police (KSP) Post 4 will be conducting periodic traffic safety checkpoints in the Post 4 area, which includes Hardin, Jefferson, Bullitt, Nelson, Meade, Breckinridge, LaRue, and Grayson counties.

These checkpoints will be conducted as part of Post 4's highway safety efforts. Troopers will be checking for violations of Kentucky traffic and regulatory laws relating to motor vehicle equipment safety, licensing of drivers, motor vehicle registration, and operation of motor vehicles while under the influence of intoxicants.

Monday evening concerning the Fiscal Year 2026-2027 budget, Municipal Road Aid, and LGEA funding, during which a citizen asked about striping the parking area by the wing of the Purple Flash Community Center. City officials said they would look into this request.

After the public hearing, the first reading of the Fiscal Year 2026-2027 budget ordinance was given.

Per the budget ordinance, the city projects General Fund revenue totaling \$1,074,684; General Fund expenditures totaling \$535,745; Sewer Fund revenue totaling \$262,300; and Sewer Fund expenditures totaling \$129,418.

A special called meeting for the second readings of the proposed 2026-2027 budget and amended Fiscal Year 2025-2026 budget ordinances will be held June 23 at 11 a.m.

In other business, the city commission:

- Held the first reading

of the amended Fiscal Year 2025-2026 budget ordinance.

- Accepted the insurance proposal from Kentucky League of Cities for property, liability, and workers' compensation.
- Heard from Caneyville Fire Chief Brian Pharris, who reported all firefighters' new gear had come in. Additionally, the Caneyville Fire Department is continuing to raise funds for the WHAS Crusade for Children as its largest fundraiser scheduled for Memorial Day weekend was rained out. About \$900 had been raised for the Crusade at press time.
- Received a report that the Caneyville Community Club's Ice Cream Social and Car Cruise-In went well, with over 30 cars participating in the cruise-in. Proceeds from the event will benefit the Community Club's Christmas for Kids and scholarships.
- Opted to rebid for the city's telecommunications franchise because no bids were received by the previous deadline. The new bids will be opened at the special called meeting on June 23 at 11 a.m.

AAA: As summer travel season begins, gas prices continue to fall

Gas prices in West Central Kentucky are 25 cents lower this week at \$3.709 per gallon, according to AAA East Central's Gas Price Report.

NATIONWIDE TRENDS:

The national average for a gallon of regular gasoline is down 16 cents since last week to \$4.16. This marks the second straight week of decline. Pump prices are cooling off as the price of crude oil remains below \$100 per barrel. But uncertainty lingers over when the Strait of Hormuz will fully reopen and resume traffic. Today's national average is 38 cents less than a year ago but \$1.04 more than a year ago.

According to new data from the Energy Information Administration (EIA),

gasoline demand decreased last week from 9.25 million barrels per day to 8.59 million. Total domestic gasoline supply increased from 211.6 million barrels to 215 million. Gasoline production decreased last week, averaging 9.4 million barrels per day.

At the close of last Wednesday's formal trading session, West Texas Intermediate rose \$2.26 to settle at \$96.02 a barrel. The EIA reports crude oil inventories decreased by 8 million barrels from the previous week. At 433.7 million barrels, U.S. crude oil inventories are about 3% below the five-year average for this time of year.

The national average per kilowatt hour of electricity at a public EV charging station remained the same

this past week at 41 cents.
