Jacalyn Ditto has been named Director of Special Education and Preschool for Grayson County Schools.

Ditto succeeds Tracie Johnston, who is retiring after 26 years of service to Grayson County Schools, including leading the district's special education and preschool programs since 2022.

With two decades in education, including leadership roles at the school, district, and state levels, Ditto brings extensive experience in special education leadership and a strong commitment to supporting students, staff, and families.

Ditto most recently served as Executive Director of Exceptional Child Education and Special Programs for Jefferson County Public Schools. Prior to that role, she served with the Kentucky Department of Education as Assistant Director of IDEA Monitoring and Results, helping school districts strengthen services for students with disabilities across the Commonwealth.

Before moving into district and state leadership, Ditto served as an elementary and special education teacher, assistant principal, principal at the Kentucky School for the Blind, and an Early Childhood Education specialist.

“Jacalyn brings an exceptional combination of classroom experience, school leadership, district

leadership, and state-level expertise to this role, plus a real passion for students and families," said Superintendent Doug Robinson. "We're excited to have her join our team."

Ditto serves in leadership roles with several statewide professional organizations, including as President-Elect of the Kentucky Council for Exceptional Children. She is a board member-at-large of the Kentucky Council for Administrators for Special Education and has also represented Kentucky in

several national organizations.

Ditto and her family live in Breckinridge County, and she looks forward to becoming part of the Grayson County community when she begins her new role on Aug. 1.

“Building positive relationships with students, families, and staff is one of the things I value most as an educator,” she said. “I look forward to listening, building those relationships, and supporting the great work already happening across the district while working together to provide the best possible educational opportunities for all students.”

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County OKs farmer's market bid, roads to be resurfaced

The Grayson County Fiscal Court, during its regular July 16 meeting, accepted a bid for the construction of a new farmer's market building and approved a resolution for the resurfacing of numerous county roads.

The court received two sealed bids for the farmer's market building, which were opened July 16. They were \$175,483.34 from Todd Steel Buildings, out of Somerset, Ky., and \$187,249 from Scott, Murphy & Daniel, out of Bowling Green, Ky.

After reviewing the bids, the fiscal court voted to accept the low bid from Todd Steel Buildings, which is for a 65'x150' building.

In May, the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board approved up to \$250,000 in state funds and \$10,000 in Grayson County funds to construct a local farmer's market building.

Additionally, the fiscal court accepted an agreement and resolution with the Kentucky Transporta-

tion Cabinet (KYTC) for the resurfacing of four county roads.

The agreement states the KYTC will reimburse the county up to \$710,000 for the resurfacing of J.D. Hudson Road from KY 185 to the end of county maintenance (3.238 miles); Pine Knob Road from KY 79 to the end of county maintenance (3.402 miles); Byrtle Grove Road from Anneta Road to the end of county maintenance (1.550 miles); and Sadler Lane from KY 187 to KY 1133 (2.917 miles).

In other business, the fiscal court:

- Approved an agreement and resolution with the KYTC for the repair/replacement of the Pleasant View Bridge.
- Approved lease agreements with the East Grayson County Fire Department for the Big Clifty Community Center and with Central Kentucky Community Action Council.
- Voted to set the small purchase maximum — the maximum amount the fiscal court may spend before being required to advertise for bids — to \$60,000
