Lessons we need to learn

"Death," said Robert M. Herhold, "is that final separation from all that we have worked for, and that we have built up, and that is near and dear to us. It is too bad that dying is the last thing we do. Because it could teach us so much about living."

There are many lessons to learn from death (Psalm 39:4-7). Some are mentioned in Psalm 39, "...know mine end," "the measure of my days," "how frail I am," "my days as a handbreadth." David asked God to make him aware of life's frailty, so he might make the most of his life. Two words are key to

understanding the message here. "Handbreadth" — a unit of measure in ancient days — about four inches wide, the approximate width of a man's hand, used in measurements. The word here suggests brevity of life.

The second word is "vanity." It means "as a breath" (James 4:14). It comes from the idea of brevity. In the sight of God, every man's life is only a moment. David came to realize that one's only real security is in God. He said that the frailty of life and the certainty of death ought to teach us to make the most of the time we have on earth. The thought of death

ought to teach us three important truths about life. The first idea death ought to teach us is to guard our time. Each of us is given a limited amount of time; therefore, use it wisely. You have heard about "saving time," but it cannot be done. You can savor time, enjoy it, and make the most of it, but you can't save it. I believe that it is more important how you spend your time than how you spend your money. If you make a mistake with your money, you can correct it, but time is lost forever. Whatever you plan to do you had better begin today. It could be your last day. Remembering that can help you to use wisely the present moment.

The second thought we ought to learn from death is the futility of trusting in things. The Psalmist said in verse 6, "He heapeth up riches, and knoweth not will get them." The man who devotes his life to the accumulation of things is a fool. He shall soon come to the end of his days on earth and leave all he has accumulated to someone else. Third, Death should teach us the necessity of faith. The Psalmist said, "My hope is in Thee." The prayer of the Psalmist should be ours: "Lord, remind me how brief my time on earth will be. Remind me that my days are numbered, and that my life is fleeing away" (NLT 39:4).

God is good to all

Psalm 118:1, O give thanks unto the Lord; for he is good: because his mercy endureth forever. 2. Let Israel now say, that his mercy endureth forever. 3. Let the house of Aaron now say, that his mercy endureth forever. 4. Let them now that fear the Lord say, that his mercy endureth forever. God is good. We can see the evidence of God's goodness everywhere we look. At times life can

become confusing — confusing to all of us. We might wonder why good things happen to bad people, or why bad things happen to Christ followers. At times we stand in amazement, or in confusion, asking, "Why?" No matter how great our service to God may be, we are never more deserving of God's goodness than anyone else. Only God can judge what is truly "good," and He bases

this on His knowledge of our hearts. Allow me to give you an example: Too much of a good thing can have negative effects. A \$10 tithe may seem like much to a person who earns only \$100 a week. But later, that same person may become more successful, or wealthy. The person may then struggle to give \$1,000, even though the amount represents the same percentage of his paycheck. God knows this about us and will bless us accordingly, so we are not tempted to turn away from

Him and worship the gift instead of the Giver. When we are not wise stewards, the Lord may withdraw some of His benefits from our lives. Instead, let us follow in the thanksgiving and praise of today's psalm. Remember, "no good thing does He withhold from those who walk uprightly" (Psalm 84:11). Every good thing comes from God (James 1:17). Walk according to His will, follow His ways, and He will shower His goodness upon you.

The real presence of the Eucharist

Many people struggle with the Christian idea of the physical presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. From the earliest days after the Resurrection, the Catholic Church has upheld this belief. Here are what a few of the Early Church Fathers had to say. Actually, the real presence was taken for granted and never debated for 1,500 years.

- The Didache or The Teaching of the Twelve Apostles, (A.D. 50-150): "Let no one eat and drink of your Eucharist but those baptized in the

name of the Lord."

- Saint Ignatius (A.D. 110), a bishop who heard Saint John preach and knew Saint Polycarp: "They abstain from the Eucharist and from prayer, because they do not admit that the flesh of our Savior Jesus Christ, the flesh that suffered for our sins ..."
- Saint Irenaeus (A.D. 177): "So then if the mixed cup and the manufactured bread receive the Word of God and become the Eucharist, that is to

say, the Blood and Body of Christ ..."

- Saint Clement of Alexander, director of the school of catechumens in Alexandria in A.D. 202: "Eat My Flesh, He says and drink My Blood. The Lord supplies us with these intimate nutrients. He delivers over His Flesh, and pours out His Blood; and nothing is lacking for the growth of His children. O incredible mystery!"
- Saint Cyprian of Carthage, (A.D. 246) a priest and later Bishop of Carthage, God says the words: "In one house shall it be eaten, ye shall

not cast its flesh outside" (Exodus 12:46). The flesh of Christ and the Lord's Sacred Body cannot be cast outside nor have believers any other home but the one Church." (The Catholic Church reserves all Eucharist that isn't consumed at Mass in the tabernacle.)

ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING 2026 PLANNING AND ZONING COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

WHEREAS, on July 19th, 1999, the City of Leitchfield, KY enacted an ordinance providing for the creation of the planning and zoning board and implemented planning and zoning restrictions in the City of Leitchfield; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to KRS 100.197 a city shall review said elements of the planning and zoning comprehensive plan every five (5) years and amend said plan as necessary. On April 13th, 2026, a public hearing was held before the Leitchfield planning and zoning board regarding the review of the comprehensive plan;

WHEREAS, on May 4th, 2026, Tyler Harrell as administrator of the city's planning and zoning presented said 2026 proposed comprehensive plan to the Leitchfield City Council at a regularly scheduled meeting for consideration and whereas after review of said comprehensive plan as presented adopts the following:

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the city of Leitchfield, Kentucky as follows: The City of Leitchfield hereby implements and adopts in its entirety the 2026 Comprehensive Plan, hereby revoking the previously implemented 2015 Comprehensive Plan.
