Kevin Horn named Isaiah House CEO

Isaiah House has named Kevin Horn as its new chief executive officer, marking a full-circle moment for the faith-based recovery organization and the man whose own life was transformed through its programs.

Horn first came to Isaiah House in 2012, where he experienced a profound personal and spiritual transformation that would shape the course of his life. Before graduating the program, Horn began working at the organization as an intern, earning \$125 per week and dedicating himself to helping others find the same hope and restoration he had received.

Over the next decade, Horn rose through the ranks of Isaiah House, serving in

a variety of leadership roles including Case Supervisor, Program Director, Vice President of Programs, Senior Vice President, and eventually President, until March 2023. In these roles, he helped guide the organization through major milestones, including state licensing and national accreditation, the development of evidence-based programming and operational systems that elevated recovery care standards across Kentucky.

Horn served as chief operating officer of Revive Ministries Inc. in Nicholasville from March 2023 to February 2026, where he further refined his leadership style and helped guide the organization's operations and strategic ini-

tiatives.

Returning to Isaiah House as CEO, Horn says he is grateful for the opportunity to lead the organization that once helped transform his life.

Isaiah House, headquartered in Harrodsburg, is widely recognized for providing high-quality, evidence-based treatment for substance use disorder. The organization is now expanding its approach by focusing on an integrated care model designed to improve patient outcomes, enhance the overall patient experience, and reduce health-care costs by breaking down traditional barriers between primary care, behavioral health, and residential treatment services.

As part of this effort, Isaiah House has recently opened four Isaiah House Community Health Centers that offer primary care, dental services, and behavioral health treatment. The new centers represent the latest development in the organization's continued growth and commitment to providing one of the region's most comprehensive networks of care for individuals and families.

"Isaiah House gave me an opportunity when I needed it most," Horn said. "To come back and lead this organization is both humbling and deeply meaningful. My heart is to ensure that every person who walks through our doors has access to the same hope, healing, and transfor-

As CEO, Horn will focus on strengthening community partnerships, expanding access to services, and guiding strategic growth across the organization while maintaining high standards of care.
