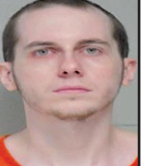

Her other sports accolades include helping the tennis program win its first ever match, winning the program's first All-A Championship in golf and two in-game championships with Burgin cheer. Hatfield also played in every game for the basketball team this season that had its first winning record since 2007. It was her first season playing basketball and she led the team in rebounds with

eight a game. Hatfield's sport of choice is track and playing other sports has helped her appreciate it more.

"I think playing sports growing up is important and I think it helps to shape the person you will be in the future. Playing different sports has taught me how to be a good teammate, perseverance and much more. I think playing different sports is one of the reasons I chose to do track in college. From a young age, I loved track and was so sure I was going to continue it in the future. I went through a stage where I was unsure if that was what I really wanted to do. After playing other sports, I think it made me realize that track was my sport and helped my decision in continuing it in college," said Hatfield.

Hatfield has made her impact in nearly every Burgin sport in her time as a Bulldog while also excelling in the classroom with a 3.75 GPA while taking college courses. Hatfield was quick to highlight that she has help along the way especially from her Head Coach, Bryan Vandiviere, who has been there every step of the way.

"If I could highlight someone who has helped me along the way it's my coach, Bryan Vandiviere. He's done more than just coach me.
