



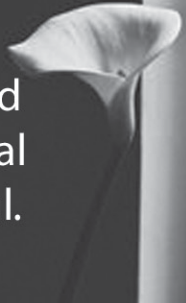

Severe Storm and Tornado Season Preparedness

Warmer weather is here, which means now is the time to prepare for severe storms and possible tornadoes. Planning ahead and understanding how warnings work can significantly reduce risk when dangerous weather develops.

According to Hart County Emergency Management Director Tony Keithley, one of the most important steps residents can take is ensuring they receive emergency alerts in a timely

manner. Keithley encourages people to rely on multiple alert sources rather than depending on just one.

"Residents can stay safer during severe storms and tornado season by relying on a mix of official warning systems, trusted national apps like FEMA and the Red Cross, local TV-station weather apps, and backup devices that continue working during outages," Keithley said. "Using several independent sources sharply reduces the chance of missing a life-saving alert."

Emergency

preparedness at home is critical. Keithley recommends every household maintain a basic emergency kit to help families get through power outages or disruptions to services.

"A household emergency kit is strongest when it includes the core survival supplies that Ready.gov and the American Red Cross consider essential for sustaining a household during power outages, disrupted services, or limited access to stores," he shared. "These items support basic needs like water, food, light, warmth,

and the ability to stay informed."

During potential weather threats, the emergency management office works closely with other agencies throughout the county to ensure information is shared quickly and consistently.

"Coordination during potential weather threats is strongest when agencies share the same information,

notice released by Hart County Fiscal Court, the county plans to request the release of \$1 million in Community Project Funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to help develop a 109-acre tract in Bonnieville into a build-ready industrial site.

The project would include excavation and sewer extension work to support future industrial development. The total estimated project cost is \$1,000,000 which would be funded through HUD's Community Project Funding program authorized under the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023.

An environmental review conducted for the project determined the development will have no significant impact on the human environment, meaning

a full Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act is not required.

Hart County Judge/Executive Joe Choate said the project has been in the works for several years and has required numerous approvals through the federal grant process. The property was donated to the county in 2021 with the intention of preparing it for potential economic development opportunities.

County leaders previously discussed selling the land for private development but decided preparing the site themselves would allow the community to maintain more control over what businesses might locate there.

"If a new business is coming to our county, we want it to be a good partner for the county," Choate said,

adding that there has not yet been any confirmed interest from industrial companies looking to locate on the property.

Judge Choate also addressed speculation circulating online about whether the property could be tied to artificial intelligence (AI) data center development.

"No, not with the county," Choate said. "Absolutely not."

He said discussions about large-scale data centers have been occurring statewide, particularly regarding their potential impact on electricity infrastructure and utility rates.

"I've got to sharpen up on these data centers a little more," Choate said. "...I think in the past what could happen, you have one of those come in, and it could affect folks' utility rates."

According to Judge Choate, the county is nearing the final steps required before requesting the federal funds that would allow initial site preparation work to begin.

"That grant was awarded in '23. It's been almost three years. It's just such a process," Choate said. "I know we're down to the last few steps to where you can request the money to start leveling a couple of spots."

Once funding is released, the county plans to prepare portions of the property so it will be ready if companies express interest in locating there.

The Environmental Review Record for the project is available for public inspection at Hart County Fiscal Court, located at 200 Main Street in Munfordville, during regular business hours.
