Outdoor Warning Sirens

Hearing a tornado siren is a signal to get indoors and seek additional information.

When sirens stop, it does not mean the severe weather threat is over!

Sirens are activated by city or county officials, not the National Weather Service.

operate within clearly defined roles, and communicate without delay," Keithley said. "Emergency managers stay aligned by continuously monitoring National Weather Service watches and warnings and maintaining close coordination with local police, fire, EMS, and schools, supported by statewide partners who work directly with the National Weather Service to keep messaging consistent. When a threat develops, agencies move into rapid information exchange through text and email updates, ensuring everyone receives the same guidance and can act quickly to protect the public."

Hart County currently has a few public locations available for shelter during severe weather.

"The Priceville Community Center, owned and operated by the Priceville Fire Department, includes a designated storm-safe area and is open to residents during dangerous conditions," Keithley said. "The Fiscal Court has spent several years working to expand permanent

storm-shelter capacity. In earlier years, the Court offered to construct shelters at Hart County Fire Department stations and at the Hart County Search and Rescue Squad, but no formal requests were submitted at that time. This year, two agencies have now filed official requests, allowing the Court to move forward. The Bonnieville Fire Department and the Hart County Search and Rescue Squad have each identified suitable locations at their stations for future shelters, and the Court plans to open construction bids...The projects are expected to be completed within the year."

Keithley also emphasized the importance of preparation for residents who rely on electricity for medical equipment.

"People who rely on powered medical devices can stay safer in severe weather by preparing early and knowing where they can access electricity," he said. "Before storms, it helps to talk with a healthcare provider about how long equipment can

safely be without power, register with the utility's medical-needs list if available, and keep backup power sources, such as charged batteries, portable power stations, or a compatible generator, ready to use. Identifying places you can go for electricity, gathering extra supplies, and keeping a small 'go bag' with medications, chargers, and device information can make evacuation faster if it becomes necessary."

"When severe weather is expected, charging all devices and backup batteries right away, alerting family or caregivers that you may need help, and confirming which shelters can support medical equipment can reduce risk during an outage," Keithley continued. "Some devices and medications, including oxygen systems, refrigerated medicines, and powered mobility equipment, may need special handling during power loss, so discussing alternatives with a healthcare professional ahead of
