The Munfordville City Council met in regular session on Monday, March 9, 2026.

Council Members Austin Grant, Jessica Nunn, Tara Wilson, Martha Taylor, and Cassie Eldridge were in attendance, as well as City Attorney Matthew Roberts, City Clerk Neva Brent, and Mayor Ricky Line.

Paige Hadden of the Barren River Area Development District informed council

members that work is underway on the county's updated strategic plan.

The plan will focus on hazard mitigation, public health and safety, tourism, downtown development, and transportation. Steering committee meetings will be held every two months at the old courthouse as officials update goals for the next five years.

Council members approved a resolution allowing the city to apply for a Kentucky

Office of Homeland Security grant to help purchase ammunition for the police department.

The council also voted to accept \$39,414.71 in municipal road aid funding.

In addition, the council approved moving forward with the next step of a USDA grant totaling approximately \$445,000.

The next meeting of the Munfordville City Council will be Monday, April 13.
