The Perry County Board of Education is proposing a general fund tax levy of 54.8 cents on real property and 54.8 cents on personal property.

The General Fund tax levied in fiscal year 2026 was 54.8 cents on real property and 54.8 cents on personal property and produced revenue of \$5,173,215.15. Additional 2026 tax revenue is expected. The proposed General Fund tax rate of 54.8 cents on real property and 54.8 cents on personal property and is expected to produce \$6,083,893.98. Of this amount, \$1,619,349.38 is from new and personal property. The compensating rate for 2027 is 53.2 cents on real property and 54.8 cents on personal property and is expected to produce \$5,951,456.79.

The proposed rate is expected to generate more revenue than received in the preceding year. The general areas to which revenue of \$910,678.83 above 2026 revenue is to be allocated are as follows: maintenance of plant \$910,678.83. Assuming a 100% tax collection in 2026 and 2027, the Perry County Board of Education anticipates an estimated \$186,549 in additional revenue from 2026 to 2027.

ORDINANCE 2027-02 AMENDING AND REPLACING 2021-05 CHAPTER 90: ANIMALS			§ 90.12 RELEASE OF IMPOUNDED DOG; FEE.		
Section	General Provisions		(A) An owner reclaiming an impounded dog shall pay a fee of \$50.00 to the City of Hazard for impoundment the first time and \$100.00 for each subsequent impoundment. The owner shall also pay a \$50.00 per day boarding bill for each day the dog is impounded by the Animal Control Officer. Proof of vaccination for rabies shall be furnished and current license shall be required before any impounded dog is released to an owner.

No owner shall fail to exercise proper care and control of his animals so as to prevent the following actions by them: excessive, continuous, or untimely barking or howling; molesting passerby; chasing vehicles; attacking other domestic animals; trespassing on school grounds; trespassing on private property; or damaging property of any nature.		
90.99 Penalty			§ 90.21 CRUELTY TO ANIMALS. No owner shall fail to provide his animals with good and wholesome food and water, proper shelter and protection from the weather, veterinary care when needed to prevent suffering, and human care and treatment. No person shall beat, cruelly ill treat, torment, overload, overwork, or chase any animal, or cause or permit any dog fight, cockfight, or other combat between animals.		
§ 90.01 DEFINITIONS. For the purpose of this chapter the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning. "AREA OF HIGH POPULATION DENSITY." Any area which contains a cluster of five or more adjacent residences. "DOG". Any member of the canine family, six months of age or over. "DOG FOUNDS." Any premises designated and operated by the Animal Control Officer under authority of the County in accord with KRS 258.195 for the purpose of impounding and caring for dogs held under the provision of this chapter. "ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER." The officer employer, appointed, and authorized by the Perry County Fiscal Court or Hazard City Commissioners to primarily enforce the dog, animal, and livestock laws of the Commonwealth and this chapter and to maintain and operate the dog pound of the County. "OWNER. " Any person, partnership, or corporation that owns, keeps, or harbors a dog.			§ 90.22 ABANDONING ANIMALS. No owner shall abandon an animal, abandonment meaning the animal for a period in excess of 24 hours without providing for someone to feed, water, and check on the animal's condition. In the event that an animal is found so abandoned, the animal may be taken by the Animal Control Officer, police officer, or humane officer, and impounded. The animal, if taken from private property, shall be kept for not less than 30 days with the same procedure to be followed as set forth in § 90.11 and § 90.12. In the event that an animal is so abandoned, the owner, rather than the person, if any, who he has charged with the animal's care shall be liable for citations for violation of this section.		
§ 90.02 "RESTRAINT." A dog shall be deemed to be restrained if kept on the premises of its owner or if accompanied by a responsible person of the owner's premises and kept under that person's control.			§ 90.23 PLACING OF POISONOUS SUBSTANCES. No person shall place any poisonous substance which may be harmful to any animal as described in this chapter in any location where it may be readily found and eaten by an animal.		
§ 90.02 STATUTORY AUTHORITY. This chapter is made in conjunction with and pursuant to KRS Chapters 258 and 436 which regulate dogs, their control, and humane treatment.			§ 90.24 MAINTAINING LIVESTOCK PROHIBITED. (A) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, no person shall house feed, or raise within the City any cattle, cows, horses, sheep, swine, goats, chickens, ducks, turkeys, geese, or other livestock. (B) This section shall not apply in areas of City that are zoned agricultural in nature nor shall this section apply to livestock brought into the City for the purpose of being shipped out of the City, or brought into the City for the purpose of slaughter by a properly licensed slaughter house. (C) The housing, feeding, and raising of animals, birds, or fowls otherwise prohibited by this section may be permitted by applying for a special permit fr the City Council. Such permits may be issued to permit circus performances o other public exhibition of entertainment events.		
§ 90.03 EXEMPTIONS. Any owner who keeps a dog on premises not within an incorporated towr a subdivision, or an area of high population density shall be exempt from the provisions of this chapter.

§ 90.10 IMMUNIZATION REQUIRED. No dog shall be permitted on the streets of the City unless the dog has been immunized by inoculation for rabies and has a tag on him showing that he has been immunized.			§ 90.99 PENALTY. (A) Any person, firm, or corporation violating the provisions of § 90.10 and § 90.24 shall be deemed guilty of a violation and shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$100.00; 2 nd violation to not more than \$150.00 for each offense; 3rd violation not less than \$150.00 to no more than \$200.00, and each day that the violation continues shall constitute a separate offense. Violators of this chapter may be issued a citation by the officer in charge of enforcement.		
§ 90.11 DOGS TO BE RESTRAINED; IMPOUNDMENT. Every dog kept on premises in this City shall be restrained. Any unrestrained dog may be taken by the Animal Control Officer or any other peace officer of this County to the dog pound and there confined for not less than seven days unless claimed by his owner. If the owner can be identified,, the owner shall immediately be notified by the Animal Control Officer to reclaim the impounded dog. If the dog is not claimed within seven days it shall be humanely destroyed or otherwise disposed of.			(B) Sections 90.01 through 90.03, 90.11 through 90.13, and 90.20 thro 90.23 shall be enforced by citation issued to the owners of any dogs not under restraint, or the owner -of any animal is in violation of the above listed sections of this chapter. If any violation continues, each day the violation continues shall be deemed a separate offense and shall be separately disposed of in the manner set out above. Upon conviction for a first offense, the penalty shall constitute and be prescribed as a violation, subject to a fine of not more than \$250.00. Second and subsequent offenses shall constitute and be prescribed as a misdemeanor, subject to a fine of not more than \$250.00, imprisonment not exceeding 90 days, or both. Violators of this chapter may be issued a citation by the officer in charge of enforcement.
