ORDINANCE AMENDING ETHICS
ORDINANCE ADOPTED IN NOVEMBER 1994

WHEREAS, City of Edmonton currently has an Ethics Ordinance creating a Board of Ethics with five (5) members; and WHEREAS, it is the Council’s desire for governmental efficiency to reduce the number of Board members to three (3) members; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EDMONTON;

Section 20 (B) of the City of Edmonton Ethics Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

(B) The Board of Ethics shall consist of three (3) members who shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to the approval of the legislative body. The initial members of the Board of Ethics shall be appointed within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this ordinance. No member of the Board of Ethics shall hold any elected or appointed office, whether paid or unpaid, or any position of employment with the city or any city agency. The members shall serve for a term of three years; except that with respect to the members initially appointed, one member shall be appointed for a term of one year, one member shall be appointed for a term of two years, and one member shall be appointed for a term of three years. Thereafter all appointments shall be for a term of three years. Each member of the Board of Ethics shall have been a resident of the city of Edmonton for at least one (1) year prior to the date of the appointment and shall reside in the city throughout the term of in office. The members of the board of ethics shall be chosen by virtue of their known and consistent reputation for integrity and their knowledge of local governmental affairs. The members may be reappointed for any number of consecutive terms.

(H) The presence of two or more members shall constitute a quorum and the affirmative vote of two (2) or more members shall be necessary for any official action to be taken. Any member of the Board of Ethics who has a conflict of interest with respect to any matter to be considered by the board shall disclose that a conflict of interest exists, shall disqualify himself or herself from voting on the matter, and shall not be counted for purposes of establishing a quorum.
