The Edmonton City Council met in regular session on Monday, August 3, at the Edmonton City Hall. Those in attendance were Mayor Doug Smith, Council members Curt Estes, Cathy Nunn, and Faye Word, Public Works Superintendent Moe Hensley, Police Chief David Robertson, 911 Director Jordan Crump, Parks & Recreation Director Brian Garrett, City Attorney Brian Pack, City Clerk/Administrator Dawn Devore, and PJ Martin from *The Herald-News*.

Mayor Doug Smith opened the meeting and declared a quorum present.

The minutes from the special meeting on July 1 and the minutes from a special meeting on July 17 were both approved without changes.

“We have received a new agreement from KYTC on the local assisted road program. LARP funds, formerly CPPB or discretionary funds for Karan Avenue and the portion of Harvey Hurt Road in the amount of



\$47,100,” stated Mayor Smith.

The agreement was approved. Then Resolution #2026-2027-01 approving the execution of the agreement between the City of Edmonton and The Transportation Cabinet allowing the mayor to sign the documentation was approved.

The mayor added, “We will continue to apply for these initial funds to assist with getting all city streets repaved. It will take some time, but we are dedicated to getting this additional assistance.”

For well over a century, families have gathered in Sulphur Well each August to celebrate a tradition that has become one of Metcalfe County’s most enduring

community events. What began in the late 1800s as a simple reunion has grown into the annual Sulphur Well Homecoming, bringing together generations of families, friends, and visitors for a weekend filled with

history, fellowship, and hometown fun.

The story of Sulphur Well itself dates back to around 1845 when local landowner Ezekiel Neal discovered a mineral-rich spring while drilling approximately

180 feet in search of saltwater. Instead, he struck water containing sulfur, magnesium, and iron that quickly became known for its believed health
