Metcalfe Hornet MS Football Team Looking to Flip the Script

The Metcalfe County middle school football Hornets are currently sitting at 2-2 with wins against Caverna and Pickett County, TN. The offense is commanded by 7th-grade quarterback #6 Kyle Park. The backfield is led by a trio of talented backs (#1 Cam Jarvis, who leads the team in rushing yards, #4 Grayson Miller, and #28 Jaxston Gilpin). The defense is anchored by Cam Jarvis, who leads the team in tackles, and 8th-grade defensive end #69 Reece Robertson.

When asked about the season, Head Coach Bryson Mayes had this to say, “This year we are hoping to have the first winning season in 15 years. The boys are determined to achieve that goal. This year we are running a completely new offense called the “flex bone”. It’s a hard nose, misdirection style offense. We have been

working since January to learn and perfect it.”

The young Hornets are working hard on changing the past perception of Hornet football. “We want to change the way people view Metcalfe football. The players have told me that they are tired of being everybody’s homecoming game, and they want to turn the program around to what it once was.” Coach Mayes is looking forward to the remainder of the season and thinks his team can produce more wins than last year. “This team is really special! I believe that they can achieve anything they set their minds to. I’ve told them that this year it’s just a matter of working harder than the other team.”

What the Hornets lack in size...they make up in heart. Coach Mayes went on to add, “We know we’ve worked harder than any team on our schedule; we just have to go get what WE deserve. I’m super excited for

the rest of the season and have high hopes for a winning season. We know that we are a small team; we know that we have a disadvantage to virtually every team we play, and we know we are outnumbered.”

Most teams on the Hornets MS football schedule are made up of mostly 8th graders. However, Coach Mayes’ team is made up of 6th-8th graders. “We know that we are always going to have 6th, 7th, 8-graders against an all 8th-grade team. None of that matters to this team; they have a goal at a winning season, and I believe nothing is going to stop them at achieving this goal.”

The Hornets return to play this Thursday when they take on Monroe County MS at home. If the Hornets can stay healthy, continue to work hard, and believe in each other...they can flip the script and change the perception of the program.

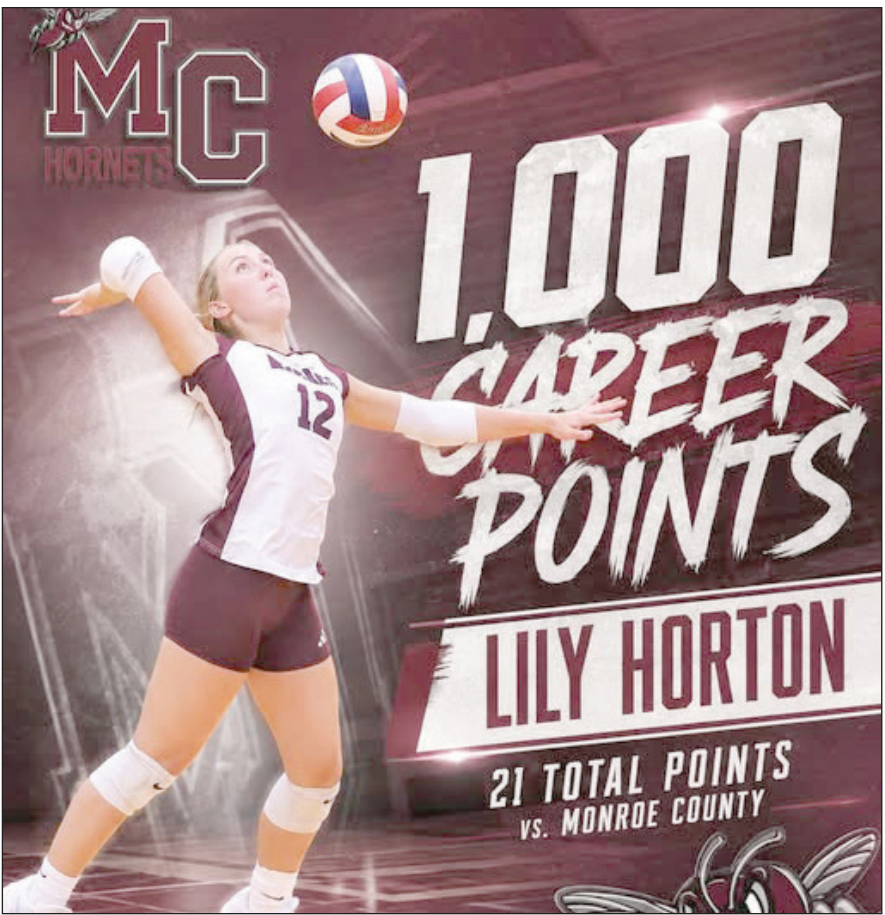
