NOW, BE IT ORDAINED By the City of Hustonville that Ordinance # 20.1 be written as follows.
SECTION 1: Customer payment obligation for meters over 1". Customer will pay all cost and fees associated with (a) the initial water meter and related equipment serving the Premises (the "Meter", (b) any replacement meter, and (c) all regular/scheduled testing of the Meter, in each case at the Provider's then-current rates and charges.
SECTION 2: If the Meter must be replaced for any reason (including age, failure, upgrade, damage, loss, tampering, or relocation), Customer will pay the full cost of replacement meter and all associated removal, installation, and restoration cost.
SECTION 3: Provider may require routine testing of the Meter at intervals determined by Provider in its reasonable discretion and consistent with applicable standards and regulations (each a "Routine Test"). Customer will pay the applicable Routine Test fee and any related cost (including removal and reinstallation, if required). Provider may require prepayment before performing a Routine Test.
SECTION 4: If customer requests a test outside of the Routine Test Schedule, Customers will pay the applicable testing fee and related costs.
